





Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)



The arcane RRS (racing rules of sailing) may discourage participation. Please come out and sail. It's all in fun. Also, be aware it was agreed long ago that sailors will call and correct fouls when rules are broken. That self-policing saves the Fleet Captain and volunteer Race Committee from having to oversee Protest Committees. This last week BLYC, overseer to our two fleets, received a technical protest, which is another matter entirely. Apparently,

after continually viewing the transom of MC1489, concern has grown in the fleet about whether the boat measures in to OD (one design) specs. Rather than referring this to the official MC over-body, several helpful sailors have agreed to analyze the boat for compliance. If you see people measuring and weighing the boat, or using a hole cutter to take core samples, pay it no mind. It's just a bunch of friendly competitors trying to serve their fellows. Watch this space for results.

Don't mix Tylenol® & alcohol

harmacists are "lucky" enough to take eight credit hours of a course called Pharmacokinetics. It's a course that delves into great detail about the ENTIRE process of everything that happens, or what could go wrong, from the moment you take your pill to the moment the drug is completely eliminated from your body. It's really complicated, and at times it can be boring, but it sure is one very important class.

This article is going to get extra nerdy at times, but I'm going to do my best to explain what happens within your body when you combine Tylenol $^{\textcircled{R}}$ (acetaminophen) and alcohol and why you should never do it!

Tylenol® is metabolized (broken down!) in the liver by an enzyme called CYP2E1. When CYP2E1 metabolizes Tylenol®, one of the metabolites that it forms is toxic to the body. Now before you panic, our body has a way to manage this toxic metabolite so that it does not result in harm to our body. We manage this toxic metabolite, called NAPQI (N-acetyl-p-benzoquinoneimine), using a compound in our body called glutathione. Glutathione works to completely detoxify the NAPQI so that no harm is done to our body. However, the supply of glutathione in our bodies is limited! When glutathione supplies are all used up, the NAPQI will bind to liver cells resulting in injury and liver cell death.

Since we need our livers to survive, you can see how this might be a problem.

If I've already completely lost you, I'm sorry! Just remember that Tylenol ${\mathbb R}$ metabolism results in a compound called

NAPQI that is super toxic to our liver cells. Under normal doses and normal circumstances, our body eliminates the NAPQI so no harm is done to our liver.

Now enter alcohol...

Sorry for getting all pharmacist-y on you, but alcohol at small concentrations is metabolized by an enzyme called alcohol dehydrogenase. However, this enzyme can only handle so much alcohol before it needs to call for help. Unfortunately for Tylenol®, it calls on its friend CYP2E1 for help. As high alcohol concentrations make their way through CYP2E1 the enzyme becomes induced, meaning there is now more CYP2E1 then there was before. OH NO!! With more CYP2E1, there is more formation of that toxic metabolite (NAPQI) from Tylenol® metabolism. With more NAPQI formation there is a greater risk for liver toxicity.

So to make this super complicated process simple: What happens when you drink alcohol and take Tylenol[®]? You screw up the metabolism of Tylenol[®] and end up with more toxic metabolites than you normally would. This might kill your liver. Chronic alcoholics have 3.5 greater odds of mortality with Tylenol[®] poisoning. Tylenol[®] is completely safe to take in normal doses, but **PLEASE DO NOT COMBINE IT WITH ALCOHOL**!

To prevent Tylenol® toxicity, do not combine Tylenol® with alcohol, and do not ingest the recommended daily limit of Tylenol® which was lowered last year from 4000mg to 3000mg (6 tablets per day). Tylenol® is found in more than 600 Rx and OTC medications, so please double check all your labels for its presence. To easily locate Tylenol®, look for acetaminophen, or that really long "A-word" listed under the "active ingredients" section of a label. Common medications that contain Tylenol® include Vicodin®, Norco®, Percocet®, Excedrin®, Dayquil®, and Nyquil®.

Need something to take before drinking? Try ibuprofen! Thanks for reading!!

STU'S STAR STUFF



ere at the lake, away from city light pollution, the night sky is so full of stars that at times it's difficult to pick out some of the major constellations that we are so used to seeing in town. Where do they all come from? Have they always just been there? Will they be there forever? In reverse order, No, No, and Stand by.

A star begins life as a nebula, a giant cloud of gas and dust. The amount of matter in this dust cloud will determine the infant star's mass, and ultimately it's life cycle. Over time, the hydrogen gas in the nebula is pulled together by gravity and it begins to spin. As the gas spins faster, it heats up and becomes as a protostar. Eventually the temperature reaches 15 million degrees and nuclear fusion occurs in the cloud's core. The cloud begins to glow brightly, contracts a little, and becomes stable. It is now a main sequence star and will remain in this stage, shining for millions to billions of years to come. This is the stage our Sun, at 4.5 billion years old, is at right now.

As the main sequence star glows, hydrogen in its core is converted into helium by nuclear fusion. When the hydrogen supply in the core begins to run out, and the star is no longer generating heat by nuclear fusion, the core becomes unstable and contracts. The outer shell of the star, which is still mostly hydrogen, starts to expand. As this giant cloud of gas is expelled, (like what I get treated to in bed many mornings) it expands, cools and glows red. The star has now reached the red giant phase. It is red because it is cooler than it was in the main sequence star stage and it is a giant because the outer shell has expanded outward. In the core of the red giant, helium fuses into carbon. All stars evolve the same way up to the red giant phase. The amount of mass a star has determines which life cycle path it will take from there.

For low-mass stars like our sun, after the helium has fused into carbon, the core collapses again. As the core collapses, the outer layers of the star are expelled. A planetary nebula is formed by the outer layers. The core remains as a white dwarf and eventually cools to become a black dwarf, hence achieving racial equality.

A massive star will undergo a supernova explosion. If the remnant of the explosion is 1.4 to about 3 times as massive as our Sun, it will become a neutron star. The core of a massive star that has more than roughly 3 times the mass of our Sun after the explosion will do something quite different. The force of gravity overcomes the nuclear forces which keep protons and neutrons from combining. The core is thus swallowed by its own gravity. It has now become a black hole which readily attracts any matter and energy that comes near it.


Even larger stars, such as Aldebaran in the constellation Taurus, that are 5 times or more massive than our Sun reach the red giant phase, their core temperature increases as carbon atoms are formed from the fusion of helium atoms. Gravity continues to pull carbon atoms together as the temperature increases and additional fusion processes proceed, forming oxygen, nitrogen, and eventually iron.


Creating heavier elements through fusing of iron requires an input of energy rather than the release of energy. Since energy is no longer being radiated from the core, in less than a second, the star begins the final phase of gravitational collapse. The core temperature rises to over 100 billion degrees as the iron atoms are crushed together. The repulsive force between the nuclei overcomes the force of gravity, and the core recoils out from the heart of the star in a shock wave, which we see as a supernova explosion.

While our sun is not fated to that kind of death, scientists know with absolute certainty that its outer layers will expand to well beyond Earth's orbit, boiling away the seas and turning you, your friends and everything to a cinder. What's not clear is if this will happen next week, next month or even in 2014.

Look for the sun most any time between 6:38 am and 9:02 pm. Outside of those times look for all the other stars of the show overhead here at the lake. They perform for free, but tipping is permitted.

Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-high heat, and lightly oil the grate.


Drizzle the olive oil over the cut sides of the tomatoes, and sprinkle with garlic, salt, and black pepper.
