






How to treat a stye

ave you ever awakened in the morning, looked in the mirror, and noticed a pimply appearing bump on your eye? If so, you may have developed a stye on your eye! Styes are formed when one of the oil secreting glands in our



eyes becomes blocked from makeup, dust, or other debris. Most styes are completely harmless, and will go away on their own in a few days, but below are some tips for what you can do to manage the unsightly, inflamed stye.

Treatment for a stye is simple and you usually do not need to go to a doctor. You can


help the stye resolve faster by applying a warm compress to the stye for 10-15 minutes a few times each day until the stye ruptures on its own. With this being said, do not try to pop the stye yourself — let it burst on its own! If you try and rupture the stye yourself, you can promote infection and create a bigger problem than what you started with.

Until your stye ruptures, don't wear makeup or contact lenses and avoid touching your eye. For the next few days while the stye tries to rupture, your eyelid might be swollen, watery, and painful.

Call your health care provider if the stye doesn't resolve in a week, or becomes more painful or swollen after several days of warm compresses. You should also see a doctor if you have vision problems or develop a fever. Keep in mind, once you start applying warm compresses, the stye should start feeling better. If it's only getting worse, you may have an infection that requires a doctor to prescribe an antibiotic.

To prevent future styes, wash off makeup at bedtime and take measures to prevent bacteria growth on makeup applicators. Makeup should be replaced every 6 months and brushes should be washed regularly. When outside, take protective measures against debris by wearing sunglasses or safety goggles, especially when mowing the lawn!

Meteors and the Supermoon

ere's something you're not used to seeing in this column... today we're going to talk about something that will happen this week. Not something that happened last week and you missed because you didn't even know about it. (Whoever writes this tripe should be fired.)

Perseid meteor shower activity should peak around Aug. 12-13 this year, but

it might be best viewed around now because of the full moon. The August supermoon most likely will have Earth's nearest neighbor dominating the sky the nights before and after Aug. 10 this year. Therefore, amateur and professional astronomers may catch their best glimpses of the Perseids this weekend.

First of all, what is a supermoon? Well, for the dozen or so whose Barker may have been misdelivered recently, a supermoon is technically known as a perigee moon, and occurs when the moon is full as it nears perigee, the point of its orbit closest to the earth. This month's supermoon is the second of three in a row and is expected to be the most remarkable of the year, as the moon will be at it's closest point to Earth.

As for the meteor show(er), the U.S. space agency crunched numbers last year that cemented the reputation of the Perseid meteor shower as the fireball

champion of all annual celestial events. The Perseid meteor shower produces more fireballs than any other.

The Comet Swift-Tuttle, aka 109P/Swift-Tuttle, generates the Perseid meteor shower. Each summer, Earth passes through a cloud of dust produced by the comet as it approaches the sun. At the peak of Earth's tour of the debris field, as many as 100 meteoroids per hour strike the atmosphere at a velocity of about 133,200 mph. The shower has been, is and will be visible between July 17 and Aug. 24 this year.

As customary with almost all celestial events in the night sky — except the odd supermoon, of course — light pollution is a key factor in viewing the Perseid meteor shower. Therefore, the best thing you can do to maximize the number of meteors you'll see, is to get as far away from urban light pollution as possible and find a location with a clear, unclouded view of the night sky. Generally not a problem here at the lake. But light from the full moon will likely obscure fainter shooting stars. Many though may be as bright as Jupiter or Venus and provide a stunning picture in the sky along side the bigger and brighter than normal supermoon.

Once you get settled into your viewing location, search for the darkest patch of sky you can find, as meteors can appear anywhere overhead. Meteors will travel in a path from the constellation for which the shower is named. This apparent point of origin is called the radiant. In the case of the Perseid meteor shower, the fireballs thus will appear to originate in the constellation Perseus.


Look for Perseus in the northeast a little before midnight. It will not get high in the northeast until 3 AM or so. INGREDIENTS

10 ears corn, husked and cleaned Cajun seasoning to taste salt and black pepper to taste 1 (1 pound) package sliced bacon 10 12x8-inch sheets aluminum foil

DIRECTIONS

Preheat an outdoor grill for high heat. Sprinkle each ear of corn with Cajun seasoning, salt, and pepper, and wrap each ear with 2 slices of bacon, covering the ear as completely as possible. (A big ear might need 3 pieces of bacon.)

Wrap the ears in aluminum foil, twisting the ends tightly to seal.

Place the wrapped corn on the preheated grill, and grill on high heat until the corn is hot, about 10 minutes per side.

Camp Tannadoonah

It's hard to believe but it's almost over!

he 2014 summer at Camp Tannadoonah is coming to a close, and what a summer it has been!

Some end-of-the-summer numbers, because I love statistics: We finished up the year with a grand total of 818 campers for the summer! That's nearly 200 more than last year's grand total of 635 (a nearly 29 percent increase in one year, in fact).

There were 466 female campers (57 percent) and 352 male campers (43 percent). It gets a little closer to 50/50 every year – last year was 59.4 percent female. The average age was 11.51, which is just slightly younger on average than last year (11.62).

By top 5 cities, 24 percent of our campers were from South Bend, 15 percent from Granger, 10 percent from Chicago, 7 percent from Mishawaka, and 7 percent from Elkhart. We had campers come all the way from France, Columbia, Bulgaria, and Canada. And 13 different states were represented: Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Ohio, Washington, New York, North Carolina, Missouri, Louisiana, Kansas, Florida, Colorado, and California!

On Tuesday this week I traveled to Camp Merrie Woode near Kalamazoo. I volunteered last winter to be an ACA (American Camp Association) Visitor, which means that once or twice a year I go to another camp to review all of the ACA standards with their staff. Every ACA-accredited camp has one of these visits every three years. Our next ACA visit at Tannadoonah will be next summer.

Camp Merrie Woode is a Girl Scout camp, and has a much larger camp "footprint" than Tannadoonah. They have 216 acres on a private lake with an island! Here at Tannadoonah we have just 44 acres. They have cabins, platform tents, and primitive camp sites. It was so interesting to see their facilities and hear about all their activities!

Wednesday evening we tried a new evening activity called Sponge Wars. The campers and staff were divided into two teams on the sports field. Each team had 3 targets on their side of the field (milk jugs sitting on top of buckets). There were large buckets and trash cans full of water placed on both sides of the field,

and 800 (!) sponges were scattered all over the field.

The objective was to score points for your team by knocking over the targets by throwing wet sponges at them. You could also take out members of the opposing team by hitting them with a sponge (temporarily giving your team an advantage). Meanwhile, we arranged for the Newberg Fire Department to bring out their fire truck and spray us all with water! Just imagine – over 100 people running around the field, soaking wet, throwing sponges at each other and at the targets. It's just too bad we didn't have a hot night!

Don't forget to come out Friday evening (the 8th) around 9 pm to watch our candlelight serenade on the pier.

And then please join us next weekend (Saturday, August 16) for our annual hog roast to celebrate a great season at Camp T! The hog roast begins at 5p m, and we ask that guests bring a dish to share. Hope to see you all there!
