




Berries & Pork

The Price of Beauty

One of the many endearing features of our community is its narrow, winding roads, which also serve as sidewalks and bike paths carved into the lush blanket of Mother Nature's greenery. The numerous such scenes that we enjoy are truly idyllic. Personally, my soul rests easier each time I turn onto Birch Rd. enter its atmosphere, and submit to its aura.

A necessary ingredient in Mother Nature's domain is growth, which translates over time into further encroachment upon the roadways, limiting of sight lines, and restrictions on where a traveler (whether by car, bike, or foot) can safely see, and/or be seen by, others. Each day of continuing or sustained growth causes our roadways to become slightly more dangerous.

If the under- (and over-) growth on your property (or in the public right of way adjacent to your property, even if on vacant property across the street from you) blocks people's vision, *it needs to be trimmed back. Please trim it back now* before anyone is hurt or anything is damaged. If you can't get, or have, the trimming done yourself (perhaps with a neighbor's assistance) feel free to call me and I'll see about organizing a work party.

Should we fail to address such safety issues, others (can you say "Road Commission" or "Power Company"?) might be inclined to act on their own. I'm guessing either of those agencies would be far less concerned with aesthetics, and therefore less likely to trim judiciously, than might those of us who live here.

So, next time you go outside or travel down your road, look hard and see if there is any living thing on or by your property that should be trimmed or cut back. If so, please proceed with the necessary surgery forthwith.





Dealing with plantar warts

Intar warts are warts that look as if there is some kind of cauliflower-like substance on the bottom of your foot. When a wart appears, it will feel hard, and the skin around the wart will thicken. In certain cases, the warts themselves can even cause pain.

But what causes warts?

In fact, they are caused by one of two things: 1) a virus that enters the skin through cuts or openings in your foot, or

2) direct contact of your skin with a virus. Luckily, the virus is not extremely contagious, but if you're walking around barefoot, you're more likely to end up with a wart.

The wart causing virus loves warm, moist environments, so be sure to wear flip-flops when using a public shower, in locker rooms, or on a pool deck. I remember showering barefoot at the YMCA after my swim practices in elementary school, and one day my dad discovered about 20 warts covering my feet and toes. After we spent a good month or two trying to get rid of the things, I started wearing flip flops on the pool deck and in the locker room!

So how do you go about killing a wart? There are a number of ways.

- 1. *Go to the doctor:* One method involves a trip to the doctor's office where they can numb the area and cut it out. This method is probably the most painful, but it will work! I've witnessed this method, and it was not pretty. But it was effective.
- 2. *Freezing it off (Compound W Freeze Off®):* I remember going to the doctor every couple weeks and having a doctor apply liquid nitrogen to my feet in an attempt to kill my warts. It hurt so badly and I still to this day have vivid memories of my feet pulsating for hours. I really don't like this method because it's very cold (-70F!), uncomfortable, and my mom thought it was a waste of money.
- 3. **Buy Compound W®(salicylic acid):** Salicylic acid works to peel away at the wart layer by layer. Apply it directly to the wart every day until the wart is gone. This is the method that my dad chose. This typically takes around twelve weeks to accomplish, but the warts will eventually go away! I rarely recommend using this method because it's very time-consuming -- having to buy and apply many bottles of salicylic acid is a big commitment!
- 4. **Duct Tape:** Putting duct tape over the wart supposedly starves the wart, eventually killing it. I




don't think this method is very effective, but it's certainly easy, low-maintenance, and inexpensive. All you do is cover the wart with duct tape for 6 days. After 6 days you remove the duct tape and use a pumice stone to grind away at the dead skin. Repeat until the wart is gone.

- 5. *Apple Cider Vinegar:* THIS WORKS SO WELL!!!! This is the method that I always tell people to use. Put apple cider vinegar on a cotton ball and duct tape it to your wart at bedtime. In the morning, remove the duct tape and cotton ball and you will notice that the wart has turned black and is dead. You can then use finger nail clippers to remove the dead skin and wait for the wart to push itself out. I've had people come up to me in the pharmacy and hug me because this method works so well!
- Do nothing: The wart will resolve on its own in 1-2 years, if you have the patience to wait that long.

As you can see, there are many ways to deal with a pesky wart, but only you can decide which route to take. Maybe the best way to deal with warts is to avoid getting them in the first place -- keep shoes or sandals on as much as possible, especially if you are in public areas!

Forget Nemo, find Leo

The Big Dipper, as you've been reminded countless times, points the way to several stars and constellations in our sky above the lake. We all remember "Arc to Arcturus and speed on to Spica," and "Follow the pointer stars to Polaris then on to Cassiopeia." But my favorite is the bottom of the Big Dipper falling out and spilling its contents onto the back of Leo the Lion.

Leo is one of the few constellations that requires little imagination to be able to say, "Oh yeah, I can see what that is." Others might include the Tea Pot, Scorpius, Cygnus the Swan and Tequila the Pink Flamingo. But how did Leo get up there? Multiple stories exist.

There are two strong contenders as to which mythical lion is represented by the constellation Leo.

The first is the Nemean lion which Hercules had to kill as the first of his 12 Labors. This fearsome beast terrorized the land, killing all who ventured near it. Not only was it more fierce, larger and stronger than other lions, but it also had the added advantage of possessing a skin which was impervious to metal, stone and wood. Since, for this reason, Hercules could not kill the lion with any weapon, I, ahem, I mean Hercules, wrestled it with his bare hands, and finally managed to strangle the animal. Seeing at once the unique protective qualities of the pelt, he removed it with one of the lion's own claws, and thereafter wore it as a cloak.

The second contender is the lion featured in the poet Ovid's tale of Pyramus and Thisbe. Both sets of parents of this young couple considered them too young to marry and stopped them from seeing each other. However, the pair made arrangements to meet secretly by a mulberry tree with white berries. When Thisbe arrived at the appointed place, a lion sprang out from some bushes and she ran away in fright. Unfortunately, her veil fluttered to the ground as she ran and the lion, bloody from its latest kill, pounced upon it. A short time later Pyramus arrived, saw his beloved's bloody veil and believed that she had been killed. Totally distraught, and unable to face life without her, he threw himself on his sword. As he

lay dying, Thisbe returned, took his sword and killed herself. (Someone needs to point out that this writer is no worse than Shakespeare in regard to stealing material.) The blood of the tragic pair colored the berries of the mulberry tree red, and so they remain to this day. Some suggest that Zeus placed Thisbe's veil in the heavens as Coma Berenices, but watchers of this space have seen other explanations for Coma.

Look for Leo below the big dipper any time during the night. His mane and head are formed by a backward facing question mark, anchored by Regulus, the bright heart of the celestial lion. Regulus is several times bigger and heavier than the Sun, and hundreds of times brighter.

Coma Berenices is behind, or to the left, of Leo's hind quarters and looks like a small semi-circle.

The show will go on forever. And, except for last week, it will always be free.


INGREDIENTS
