The origins of the solar system

ur sun, the Earth, moon and all the other planets, moons and asteroids, in other words, our solar system, formed about four and a half billion years ago from a nebulous swirling cloud of gas and dust. This nebula started as a big shapeless blob. So how did our solar system end up with all of our planets and moons orbiting in a flat disk?

We've all seen the planetary model of the atom, which is definitely wrong when applied to atoms. But it also kind of suggests that planets might revolve around the sun every which way. So is our solar system somehow special in its flatness? Or is the planetary model of the atom doubly wrong?

Well, our solar system definitely isn't alone. Many galaxies are flat. Saturn's rings are flat. Black hole excretion disks are flat. So why, when there is all of 3D space to fill, does the universe have this preference for flatness?

The answer has to do with two things - collisions and the fact that we live in 3 dimensions. Any time a bunch of objects held together by gravity are zooming and circling around, their individual paths are nearly impossible to predict. And yet, collected together, they have a single total amount that they spin about their center of mass. It may be hard to figure out exactly what direction that rotation is in, but the mathematics implies that there must be some direction in which that cloud, taken as a whole, spins.

Now, in two dimensions, a cloud of particles rotating in a plane is flat by definition. It's in two dimensions. But in three dimensions, even though the rotation of the cloud is given by one plane, particles can whiz around far up and down from that plane. As the particles bump into each other, all the up and down motion tends to cancel out, its energy lost in crashing and clumping. Yet the whole mass must continue spinning, because in our universe, the total amount of spinning in an isolated system always stays the same. So, over time, through collisions and crashes, the cloud loses its loft and flattens into a roughly two dimensional disk shape, like a solar system or a spiral galaxy.

However, in four spacial dimensions the math works out such that there can be two separate and complimentary planes of rotation, which is both really, really hard for out 3D thinking brains to picture and also means that there is no up and down direction by which particles lose energy by collisions. So a cloud of particles can continue to be just that - a cloud. And thus, only in three dimensions can a nebula or infant galaxy start out

not flat and end up flat. Which is definitely a good thing because we need all that matter to clump together in order for stars and planets to form, and for us to exist.

Crazy stuff. Get out there and check it out. No charge.



Grilled Italian Sausage with Marinated Tomatoes

"This sandwich is a tasty way to serve Italian sausages. It is a Friday night regular for my family."

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon fresh-ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 vine-ripened tomatoes, each cut into 6 slices
- 1/3 red onion, thinly sliced
- 6 (4 ounce) mild Italian sausage links
- 6 French rolls, halved lengthwise

Directions:

1. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium heat.

2. Whisk together red wine vinegar, balsamic vinegar, salt, pepper, oregano, basil, and olive oil in a small bowl. Arrange the tomato and onion slices on a serving platter, and pour dressing overtop. Allow to marinate at room temperature while you cook the sausages.

3. Pierce the sausages with the tip of a sharp knife a few times, then place onto the grill. Cook until no longer pink in the center, turning them frequently so that they cook evenly and have lightly browned, about 15 minutes total. Serve on French rolls with marinated tomatoes and onions.

Camp Tannadoonah — Super week kicks off!

T t was a great holiday weekend at the lake! Thank you to everyone who came out to the Pancake Breakfast at camp! I don't know what the final count was, but it sure seemed like a huge crowd to me. Many, many thanks to the pancake breakfast crew who helped organize, cook, clean up, and serve us all on Sunday morning. You guys did a great job!

Up here at camp we're getting ready to kick off our Super Week session at camp. On Wednesday (July 6), we have 77 campers arriving at camp – some of them will stay just for the three-day "Mini Camp," while some will stay through next week for the ten-day "Super Week." The theme for mini week is Circus, and for the full week (session 4) it's Hawaiian Week. We'll be having luau at camp on Friday night next week!

The week of July 24 - 30 is Holidays Week, and on Wednesday night that week (July 27) we will be Trick or Treating around the lake! So if you're going to home, and would like to provide treats for the trick or treaters, there will be approximately 60 kids. We have 120 in camp that week - so we'll o groups. One group will go along the north shore and the first bit of the east side. The other group will go through the cove and along the west side.

Over the weekend we hit 900 camper registrations! This is the first time we've ever reached 900 – the previous record was last year's 847 camper total. It's really exciting to be able to say we're going to serve 900 youth this summer at camp.

We've also been able to provide campership funding to more campers this summer than ever before. That's part of the reason we've been able to serve so many campers. Many kids are unable to attend camp without financial assistance, and we're very happy to be able to help nearly all the campers who apply for camperships.

Our campership funds come from a variety of sources. We received a very generous grant from the United Way of St. Joseph county, which covered scholarships for about 45 campers this year. We also received campership funds from last year's House Walk at Birch Lake, the Community Foundation of St. Joseph County, South Bend Kiwanis, and many individual donors. We are very grateful to everyone who has contributed to the campership fund. Thanks to your generosity, we have been able provide full or partial scholarships to approximately 105 campers this year!

We've been accomplishing a lot of projects at camp as well. We just purchased a camp pickup this past week, which will help Ranger Bob a lot! Over the holiday weekend we had a large number of trees taken down and cleared away - mostly dead ash trees. Ranger Bob has been working on redoing our laundry area in Main Lodge, and installing two new washer and dryer sets. Next week he plans to finish off a new bedroom in Main Lodge for our assistant camp director. And he's going to be building a stage near the old archery range, where we have our nightly camp fires and end of the week ceremonies. It's very exciting to be getting so many things done!
