DEQ grants permit

On 4/27/16, representatives from Michigan's Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) held a hearing at the Porter Township Fire Station to collect information relative a permit application they had received on behalf of a Birch Lake riparian to dredge and install a permanent dock and boat house in front of that riparian's property. In late June of 2016, a slightly modified version of that permit was approved by DEQ staff. According to Porter Township Clerk Marty Russell, township authorities have advised the riparian that the proposed boat house is in conflict with existing township ordinances, and will not be granted a building





Annual E Coli Survey

Starting in 2008, then based on some concerns following the installation of the sewer system around the lake, we have annually conducted surveys of the lake for the intestinal bacteria E coli.

A normal part of the bacterial population in warm blooded animals, E coli is typically by itself not an issue from a disease causing perspective, but is instead commonly considered a "marker" bacteria

We test for this bacteria because it is effectively an indicator organism for potential pollution, if found in large numbers. Lots of E coli might mean lots of other organisms that might have negative consequences on the health of people and animals.

Fortunately, we have never found E coli in the lake beyond what one might expect from background and that includes this year. "Background" means we have gulls, geese, ducks, muskrats, dogs, cats, raccoons, etc. that might leave the occasional deposit with some E coli that quickly becomes diluted so that it is either not, or just barely, mea-

surable

For the purposes of swimming, water sports, and general lake play, the levels that we have measured have consistently been only a minute fraction of the maximum levels the DEQ provides for guidance regarding safety.

This year we sampled 6 locations and used a test procedure and medium called "Coliscan" from Micrology Labs in Goshen. We can identify the presence of single bacteria due to colony formation following growth in the media that allows us to identify E coli.

Most of the triplicate samples were negative for any E coli and in those that showed the presence of E coli, it was only a minute few per 100 milliners of sample.

The only exception to this is the inlet stream, on the Northeast side of the lake, from the wetlands. This has always had an elevated level of E coli, which is so quickly diluted upon entering the lake that it is hard to find even a few feet away from where the stream enters the lake.

We know that the E coli found in



this stream are from wildlife in the wetlands etc. because we have had it genotyped and found that it was not human.

In summary, the few E coli found in the lake were from natural sources, i.e. local wildlife etc. and not from any sources of pollution and essentially all were way below levels causing any concern

Swim safely.

Birch Lake & the Underground Railroad

One of the principal grievances of the southern slave owners before the Civil War was the Underground Railroad.

Quakers from Pennsylvania came into Michigan and purchased sections of land around Birch Lake and Calvin Center... The Underground railway was a route over which the black men and their families were carried on horseback or by wagon, at night from one station to another. These stations were usually about twenty miles apart. Two principal routes were used, one coming up from Cincinnati through Indiana and the other from St. Louis through Illinois. These two routes converged just east of Cassopolis at the home of Stephen Bogue. A monument now marks this spot on Route M-60. This was the Michigan terminal of the Underground Railroad. Bogue and Josiah Osborne were the principal operators and the most important men in this undertaking.

Osborne was located on the farm that is known as Hilrings Lakeland Gardens. He operated a nursery here as far back as 1850, furnishing shade and fruit trees for the surrounding country.

In 1847, slave owners from Bourbon Co., Kentucky organized an expedition to come to Michigan to recover some of their runaway slaves. They arrived in the month of August and camped near Shavehead Lake. They knew exactly where the runaways were living as they had sent a spy up the previous winter. The spy had made maps and reported their location to the slave owners.

The Kentuckians captured several men, women, and a baby living on the Odell farm. The alarm spread and from all over the Birch Lake area angry farmers gathered, armed with guns, scythes, and clubs. The Kentuckians were



stopped and surrounded at the Osborne farm. Their wagons were overturned and later dumped into Birch Lake.

The black people were again free and the slave owners left to return to their homes the best way they could. After returning to Kentucky, they wrote many threatening letters to the farmers around Birch Lake, which fanned the flames of the coming Civil War.

The wagons that were dumped in Birch Lake were visible for many years on the east side of the Lake. In more recent years, pieces of these wagons have been sighted and brought up from the soft marl bottom. (Birch Barker 7/2/77)

In case any of you noticed some strange goings-on around the water in front of Camp Tannadoonah, here's what is happening! The Cass Co. Historical has been diving for the sunken wagon that may have been there since 1848 when the slaves escaped to this area and were being protected and hidden from the owners. They say that they have

located the "buck board" but it may take many more hours to remove all the mud before they attempt to raise it from the Lake and treat it. (Birch Barker 7/27/85)

Three skin divers who fished some wagon parts out of Birch Lake, near Vandalia, have turned their find over to the State Historical Commission.

Commission experts will attempt to determine if the divers located a relic of pre-Civil War days that figures in stories about the slave traffic of more than a century ago.

Three Lansing men were prepared to go back after the rest of the wagon if study shows their weekend recovery has historical value.

Ervin Morris, Ira Cooper and Merritt Nevins brought from the bottom of Birch Lake, two metal rear wagon wheels, a connecting axle and a reach apparently broken off between the rear and front wheel assemblies. The rusty objects appeared to first observers to be hand forged.

Tales handed down in the Vandalia-Cassopolis area had it that a group of Kentucky slave-owners seeking runaways left the wagon hidden in the woods while they searched. Local abolitionists then were supposed to have dragged the vehicle to Birch Lake and sunk it about 100 ft. off shore. (From a newspaper clipping that appears in "A Scrapbook History of Early Decatur, MI" on a page dated 1957.)







STU'S STAR STUFF



Getting ahead of the game

I y track record has shown that I seem to have a propensity to inform you about star stuff after the fact. Today I'm getting ahead of the game.

Like the Eta Aquarids in May, the Delta Aquarid meteor shower in July favors the Southern Hemisphere and tropical latitudes in the Northern Hemisphere. The meteors appear to radiate from near the star Skat or Delta in the constellation Aquarius, the Water Bearer, and can still be seen in the late night sky here at the lake.

The maximum hourly rate can reach 15-20 meteors in a dark sky. The nominal peak is around a week from now, July 27-30, but, unlike many meteor showers, the Delta Aquarids lack a very definite peak. Instead, these medium-speed meteors ramble along fairly steadily throughout late July and early August. An hour or two before dawn usually presents the most favorable view. At the shower's peak in late July, the rather faint Delta Aquarid meteors will have to somewhat contend with the light of a waning crescent moon. But the moon turns new in early August, enabling you to view some Delta Aquarids after the peak date.

In August, around the 12th, before dawn, the Perseid meteor shower is perhaps the best meteor shower of the year for us here at the lake. Sadly, the rather bright waxing gibbous moon, staying out until after midnight, will obtrude on this year's shower, especially in the earlier evening hours. Your best bet is to watch after moonset and before dawn August 12.

The Perseid shower builds gradually to a peak, often producing 50 to 100 meteors per hour in a dark sky at the peak, and, for us at Birch Lake, this shower comes when the weather is warm. The Perseids tend to strengthen in number as late night deepens into midnight, and typically produce the most meteors in the wee hours before dawn. They radiate from a point in the constellation Perseus, the Hero, but as with all meteor shower radiant points, you don't really need to know where to find Perseus to watch the show; because the meteors can appear in all parts of the sky. They are typically fast and bright meteors. They frequently leave persistent trails.

Every year, you can look for the Perseids to peak around August 10-13. The predicted peak morning in 2016 is August 12. The Perseids combine with the Delta Aquarid shower to produce a dazzling display of shooting stars on what are, for us Birch Lakers, warm summer nights.

In 2016, as always, the Perseid meteors will be building to a peak from early August until the peak nights; afterwards, they drop off fairly rapidly. Despite the waxing gibbous moon interfering with the show, the Perseid meteor shower should still put on a good show.

For maximum results, watch after moonset and before dawn August 11, 12 and 13. And, if there are clouds, I'll gladly refund your price of admission to the show.

Don't say I didn't tell you in advance. Get out there and check it out. No charge.





— Camp Tannadoonah -

It's Hawaiian Week at camp this week, and the weather has been making it feel like we're actually in Hawaii! On Sunday night we played "Capture the Lei." Tuesday we kept the kids cool by having a Sponge War. We spread 400 sponges out all over the sports field, along with buckets of cold water, and the kids throw them at each other. Plus, they throw them at jugs to score points for their team. But mostly they just enjoy hitting their friends with the sponges!

Don't forget to mark your calendars for the 27 th of July – that's the day we will be taking our kids Trick or Treating around the lake for Holidays Week. We have 122 campers registered that week, so there will be two groups of about 60 campers, one going towards the cove and along the west side (ending near Niezgodski's) and one going along the north shore and east side (ending near Curtis's). The campers will have to sing you a camp song or two to get treats!

These next couple weeks are super busy here at camp! We have 109 campers this week, 115 next week, 122 week 6, 111 week 7, and 113 week 8. Every week now has a wait list for overnight spots. We do still have spaces for day campers, though. We have 111 camper beds for overnight spots, but we are licensed for up to 125 campers, so we can have as many as 14 day campers per week to fill up those remaining spots. We're right at 900 total for the summer!

With this being the first really hot week of the summer, we've been talking to the staff about how we handle these very hot days, and keep the kids healthy. Usually when the temperature gets above 90 we have a mandatory swim in the afternoon to help everyone cool down.

Plus, we require that the second item at store for every kid is a bottle of water, and that they all drink at least one glass of water at meals before they can have juice or milk. And we try to plan lots of water-based evening programs, like sponge wars, or water relays, or cardboard boat races, so that we spend as much time in the lake as we possibly can.

We also have an air conditioner in the nurse's cabin, so if anyone does get overheated, they can go to the nurse's cabin to cool down. Once the heat index hits 90 we turn on the air conditioner and get that room cooled down.

This week is the first week that our CIT 3 group is here at camp. CIT 3 is a brand new program this year, for 17 year olds who are interested in being counselors and have completed the CIT 1 and CIT 2 programs in the past. We are gradually shifting towards only hiring staff who are 18 and older, so we created a third level to the CIT program to have something for the 17 year olds who are too old to be campers to do at camp.

The CIT 3s are shadowing counselors, helping in the cabins, helping to lead activities, and getting lots of mentoring from our CIT Director, Miss Julie. Miss Julie is a former Camp Tannadoonah counselor and waterfront director, and she is now a High School English teacher in Cassopolis. So she's really great at working with our older teens and teaching them the skills that they will need to be amazing counselors in the future.

We're really excited about the addition of this new program, and look forward to seeing these teens become staff members in the future. This year we have just three 17 year olds in the program, and they're all doing a great job so far! They will be here for four weeks this summer for their training.
