## No wake request still in effect

With many Cass County Michigan lake levels still extremely high Cass County's Office of Emergency Management and the Cass County Drain Commissioner are once again asking boaters to refrain from causing wakes while enjoying the lakes on Tuesday, August 23 through Thursday, September 1.

With the recent heavy rains many Cass County Michigan lakes and streams remain at extremely high and hazardous levels. High lake levels will make boating more hazardous; boaters and anglers should prepare for these conditions and use extra caution.

With extremely high lake levels, wakes will cause shoreline damage, docks and boats to come unattached,

- Use caution when launching because high water can make ramps tricky. Be patient if others take a little longer than normal.
- When boating near the shore or in coves, go slow to avoid underwater obstacles such as signposts, trees, stumps and other obstructions that are normally on dry ground.
- Many people who drown consume alcohol before their accident, so skip alcohol if you plan to be in or on the water.

# STU'S STAR STUFF



ow. Last week got a little out of control. Sorry. But I won't torture you much longer. I promise.

Let's talk about stars. Well, not just stars, but anything that can be observed in the night sky - meaning planets, asteroids, the sun and moon and even satellites. (OK, so the sun isn't observable in the night sky. You can't fire me for that mistake because I'm already quitting. So there.)

Anyway, any object up there has a relative brightness. This brightness is referred to as magnitude. The scale of magnitude of brightness is a bit misleading. A star of second magnitude is not as bright as a star of first magnitude, or zero magnitude or even negative one magnitude. The concept is similar to some water skiers on the east shore vs. some on the north shore. North shore skiers are brighter and thus have a lower order of magnitude. But I digress.

Astronomers use the term apparent magnitude to describe how bright an object appears in the sky from Earth. The idea of a magnitude scale dates back to Hipparchus (around 150 BC) who invented a scale to describe the brightness of the stars he could see. He assigned an apparent magnitude of 1 to the brightest stars in the sky, and he gave the dimmest stars he could see an apparent magnitude of 6. He did not include the sun, moon, planets or Baucus (quite dim) in his system.

The magnitude scale astronomers use today is based on Hipparchus'


system, but has been expanded since the invention of the telescope. In this system, the brighter an object appears, the lower its magnitude. Some of the brightest objects (including the sun and planets) visible in the sky have negative values for apparent magnitude. The dimmest objects (see aforementioned) detected with the Hubble Space Telescope have apparent magnitudes of 30 or more.

Let's make some more relevant comparisons... (see chart above)

Get out there and look for the brightest stars in the show - like Simone Biles, and Michael Phelps, and more. That show was free for the last two weeks. And the one overhead is free every night. Check out brilliant Mars, Saturn and Antares low in the south. Definitely worth the price of admission.


















## Pan seared pork & fried green tomato salad

## Ingredients:

- 1 pound pork tenderloin
- Salt and ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup cornmeal
- 1 egg, well beaten
- 2 small green tomatoes, sliced 1/2-inch thick
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 cup watercress
- 2 ounces crumbled blue cheese
- $\blacksquare$  1/3 cup bottled sweet and sour sauce (or red pepper jelly, warmed, and mixed with 1 to 2
- Tbsp. cider vinegar)

## Directions:

- 1. Slice tenderloin crosswise in 12 slices. Slightly flatten with palm of hand. Sprinkle with salt and pepper.
- 2. In shallow dish, combine cornmeal, 1/2 tsp. salt, and 1/2 tsp. pepper. Place beaten egg in second shallow dish. Dip tomato slices in egg, then coat in cornmeal mixture; set aside.
- 3. In 12-inch skillet heat 1 Tbsp. oil over medium-high heat. Cook pork

for 3 minutes each side, until golden brown on outside and slightly pink inside. Transfer to platter; cover to keep warm.

4. Add 1 Tbsp. oil to skillet. Cook tomato slices for 2 to 3 minutes each side until golden, adding oil if necessary. Serve pork and tomatoes with watercress and blue cheese. Drizzle sweet and sour sauce.




