**DNS** (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season.; **DNF** (Did Not Finish), DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place).; **DNF**, **DSQ** not counted toward minimum number of races needed; **CB** - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total; **SEASON POINTS** are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.); **SEASON PLACE** = total season points/number of races attempted; **CREW** - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat.

## — Water Quality Report —

## The Birch Lake shoreline

he overall long-term health and process of aging of a lake is in large part a function of the shoreline surrounding the lake. 2007's "National Lakeshore Assessment" indicated that far more Michigan inland lakes are stressed by poor shoreline conditions than by excesses of nutrients or turbidity. The shoreline dictates what gets (by preventing a lot of undesirable matter from getting) into a lake, provides key animal habitat and breeding sites, serves as important fish nursery areas and helps to prevent (or possibly hastens) soil erosion.

Fortunately, our lake is not river or stream fed, thus we are spared getting nutrients and other undesirable "stuff" from upstream. However, we do have a watershed that includes some farm fields and due to the topography of the lake basin, our cottages/homes are close to the lake, providing lots of impermeable surfaces (roofs, roads, driveways) in the lake basin.

In order to help gain a better understanding of our shoreline and how a shoreline impacts a lake, please consider a couple of things that can jumpstart your education.

1. Go to www.mishorelinepartnership.org for a general education on shorelines and their impacts on lakes.

- 2. Go to www.mishorelandstewards.org. The site will elaborate on some issues from the above site, but also provides a way for you to take a survey anonymously to rate (non-judgmentally) your own shoreline.
- 3. After looking at these sites and gaining some idea as to what different shoreline characteristics might look like and how they affect a lake, spend some time on your next slow boat ride around the lake examining the shoreline. Get a little closer than normal and actually look for the distribution of seawalls, rock walls, natural shorelines, plant growths close to the shore, moved lawns down to the shore, etc. Also, in that context look at the depth of properties and think about what a big rain might do at each location. Consider making this a group project on an elementary basis. Talk and discuss, do not judge, but rather observe what is real at this time.

Members of the Water Quality Committee will be doing a side by side with a representative of the DEQ shoreline partnership in mid-July as part of what is called "Score the Shore." We will evaluate the entire shoreline and a number of characteristics to provide a score for the lake shoreline. We will report on this, perhaps making suggestions based on it, and look to get any feedback we



can from the lake residents.

For most of us, our shoreline treatments have been in place for many years, maybe even preceding us by one or more owners. Further, changes in treatments could be very expensive and/or difficult to perform. So our goal is not to pressure anybody into changing their shoreline treatment at this time but simply get you to start to think about what a healthier treatment at your place might look like.

# Please be SAFE!

## **Know and Obey the Boating Safety Laws!**

In Michigan, "reckless operation" of a boat, personal watercraft (JetSki), water skis, tubes, etc. which disregards the safety or rights of others or endangers people or property are illegal.

Some examples are:

- Weaving through traffic or swerving at the last possible moment in order to avoid collision
- Jumping the wake of another vessel
- lacktriangledown Chasing, harassing, or disturbing wildlife
- Causing damage from the wake of your vessel

*Failure To Regulate Speed* is operating a boat at speeds that may cause danger to life or property of any other person or at speeds that will not permit you to bring your vessel to a safe stop.

### It is illegal to operate a boat:

- Over 55 mph
- At greater than "slow, no wake speed" when a person is in on the foredeck of a boat
- Faster than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions (weather, traffic, etc.)

Improper Distance is not maintaining a proper distance while operating a boat or towing a person. To maintain a proper distance when you are operating at greater than "slow, no wake speed" the boat or persons being towed **must not be** 

#### within 100 feet of: ■ A shoreline

- Any moored or anchored vessel
- $\blacksquare$  A dock or raft
- Any marked swimming area or person(s) in the water "Slow, No Wake Speed" means the slowest speed at which it is still possible to maintain steering, and which does not

create a wake

 ${\it Improper \, Direction}$  is defined as the failure to operate in a COUNTERCLOCKWISE direction.

**Riding on the Bow is illegal** if the vessel is not equipped with bow seating and the vessel is operating at greater than "slow, no wake speed." Persons also are not allowed to ride on the gunwale. While underway, persons on a vessel may not sit, stand, or walk on any portion of a vessel not designed for that purpose.

*Insufficient equipment* is operating a vessel that is not carrying, storing, maintaining, and using marine safety equipment on board the vessel as required by the Department of Natural Resources.

# RESTRICTED AREA Camp Tannadoonah



Under Michigan law, Boating in Restricted Areas is defined as operating within a restricted area clearly marked by buoys, beacons, diver-down flags, etc.

On Birch Lake the area marked by the buoys in front of Camp Tannadoonah on the north shore is a legally designated swim area that

### Campaign seeks to reduce boating under the influence

s the July Fourth holiday approaches, Michigan Department of Natural Resources conservation officers will focus on keeping boaters safe through heightened awareness and enforcement of boating under the influence laws. The initiative is part of the national Operation Dry Water campaign, which runs through July 2.

The annual campaign is launched just prior to the July Fourth weekend, when more boaters take to the water and alcohol use increases. It is in coordination with the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators, the U.S. Coast Guard and other partners. Through this stepped-up enforcement, the DNR is raising awareness of the hazards associated with boating under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and is working to decrease the number of accidents attributed to impaired boating and other unsafe boating practices.

"Alcohol and boating don't mix," said the DNR's Lt. Tom Wanless, Michigan's boating law administrator. "Using alcohol impairs reaction time and judgment, just as if you were driving a car. In fact, the effects of alcohol and certain medications are increased on the water due to added stress factors such as the sun, heat, wind, wave motion and engine noise. So be smart and stay sober when boating, and don't put yourself and



others at risk."

In Michigan, operating a motorboat while under the influence of alcohol — which means the person has a blood alcohol content of 0.08 grams or more — or under the influence of a controlled substance is a misdemeanor punishable by fines up to \$500, community service and up to 93 days in jail. It also can result in the loss of boating privileges for at least one year.

If a person is killed or injured due to a driver operating a boat while under the influence, the driver could be charged with a felony, punishable by fines up to \$10,000 and up to 15 years in prison.

Boaters can do their part to stay safe on the water by:

- Boating sober. Alcohol use is the leading contributing factor in recreational boater deaths. Alcohol and drug use impairs a boater's judgment, balance, vision and reaction time.
- Wearing a life jacket. Eighty-five percent of drowning victims in the U.S. were



not wearing life jackets.

- Taking a boating safety course. The DNR recommends a safety course for anyone who plans to use a boat or personal watercraft. Classes are offered at different locations throughout the state and online, making it convenient and affordable.
- Learn more about boating regulations and safety in Michigan at www.michigan.gov/boating.

All levity aside, the boys in Barenaked Ladies pretty much got it right. A Belgian priest named Georges Lemaître first suggested the big bang theory in 1927 when he theorized that the universe began from a single primordial atom. The idea subsequently received major boosts by Edwin Hubble's observations that galaxies are speeding away from us in all directions, and from the discovery of cosmic microwave radiation by Arno Penzias and Robert Wilson.

Fred Hoyle can be credited with first use of the term "Big Bang" He became one of Britain's best-known astronomers in 1950 with his broadcast lectures on "The Nature of the Universe." He recalled using "Big Bang" for the first time in the last of those talks, but with derision to describe a theory on the origin of the universe that he didn't accept.

Hoyle believed the universe came from a continuing pattern of development having no beginning and no end. But over the years this view was shared by fewer and fewer scientists as the Big Bang theory gained greater acceptance.



## Summer recipes using fresh berries

### Red, white and blue strawberry shortcake

"Spectacular Fourth of July Dessert! Present at night with a couple of sparklers for the best effect. Can make with shortcake mix, too."

Original recipe yields 18 servings

### Ingredients

- 1 (18.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix
- 1 (8 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed
- · 1 pint blueberries, rinsed and drained
- 2 pints fresh strawberries, rinsed and sliced

### **Directions**

- 1. Prepare cake according to package directions and bake in a 9x13 inch pan. Cool completely.
- 2. Frost cake with whipped topping. Place blueberries in a square in the corner, and arrange sliced strawberries as stripes to make an American flag.

Chill until serving.

### **Drunken Berries**

"Beautiful summer dessert using fresh berries and a splash of pear liqueur. Enjoy a la carte or a la mode. Exceptionally lovely on the Fourth of July. Serve berries by themselves or over vanilla gelato, with a small amount of excess liquid - but it should not be a berry soup."

Original recipe yields 8 servings

#### *Ingredients*

- 1 1/4 cups white sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/4 cup pear liqueur
- 1 pound fresh strawberries, hulled
- 1 pint blueberries
- 1 pint fresh blackberries

#### **Directions**

- 1. Combine sugar with water in a saucepan over medium-high heat, stirring until the sugar has dissolved and the mixture comes to a boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 5 minutes; remove from heat and let stand 5 more minutes.
- 2. Stir pear liqueur into the syrup and refrigerate for 1 hour.
- 3. Gently combine strawberries, blueberries, and blackberries in a large bowl and pour syrup over the berries to coat. Allow berries to stand for about 3 hours to absorb flavors. Mixture can stand up to 3 days if desired.

is a member of the waterfront staff, and loves teaching boating and skiing.




