— Water Quality Report —

formally for the first of the season article, we would review the status of the lake as reflected by the data from the testing that had been done the prior year in concert with the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program (CLMP). However, the testing program was canceled for 2020 due to budget issues, and we do not have new data to communicate. Budgeting has been restored and we are enrolled in all the programs available for 2021, and will be collecting information on water clarity, chlorophyll, phosphorous, oxygen and temperature gradients, as well as possibly conducting an aquatic plant watch, and another round of score the shore. The latter two are time intense and best done with some expert help from the state, which we were fortunate to have previously. To familiarize yourself with these different data points and programs we strongly suggest you read the 2019 lake report. Included in this report is some recent history so as to permit the viewing of trends etc. The 2019 data were particularly good and should serve as a good baseline for comparisons in the future. The report is easy to get online. If using a computer type in micorps.net. This will take you to the Michigan Clean Water Corps site. You can navigate around this site for lots of general information but to get to the report go the Lakes heading and pull up Individual Lake Reports. Clicking on that will show you the different counties that have lakes in the program. Click on Cass County and Birch Lake is the first

document encountered. Click on this and read. If using a phone (I phone) again type in micorps.net. This will bring up a page where lake monitoring is the first heading. Tap that to bring up Lake Monitoring page. Go to menu in upper right (the three dashed lines). Tap that and you will see. Again, go to lake monitoring, and tapping that will bring up a listing that includes Individual Lake reports. Additionally, we would suggest you look at the Michigan Lakes and Streams website. We are members of this organization and there is a lot of information that is available on this site regarding programs you might have an interest in and which we may report on in the future. Type in mymlsa.org to get to this site.

Last year we still had the annual survey for, especially Eurasian milfoil conducted by an outside contracted organization. The locations of the milfoil infestations (gradually reducing over the vears) and the calendar for treatment were reported on last year. A new survey will be conducted in the next couple of weeks and information regarding the survey and treatment will be found in later Barkers. Additionally, we participated in a program through Michigan State University, EGLE, and the University of Montana to look at hybrid milfoil and evolving issues that could affect treatment. We will provide a report on a zoom meeting with the various parties on what may be relevant for Birch Lake in a later article. The annual survey



for invasive species is a bit different from the aquatic plant watch through the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program, but complimentary and educational. Finally, a shoreline invasive species (purple loosestrife) that you may not have seen much is due to the concerted efforts of one of our members, Bruce Wagner. He surveys the lake and where he sees it, arranges for the removal of this invasive species. If unmolested, it would produce dense stands of this plant in shallow shoreline areas.

Finally, the members of the Water Quality Committee are to put it loosely, getting a bit up there in years. If some of the younger or even newer lake residents would like to look into the Water Quality Committee, please contact Paul Fallon, the committee chair.

THE "SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY"

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues

Hot spinach and Artichoke Dip

t's deliciously rich,
perfectly creamy and
cheesy, brimming
with spinach and artichokes and it's always
a crowd favorite. This
version is oven baked

Ingredients

- •8 slices bacon
- •1 (10 ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and drained
- •1 (14 ounce) can quartered marinated artichoke hearts, drained
- •1 (5 ounce) container garlic-herb flavored cheese



spread

- •1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- •1 (8 ounce) container sour cream
 - •½ cup mayonnaise

Directions

•Step 1 - Preheat oven

to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).

- •Step 2 Place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium high heat until evenly brown. Drain and crumble into a medium bowl.
- Step 3 Mix spinach, artichoke hearts, garlic-herb flavored cheese spread, Parmesan cheese, sour cream and mayonnaise into the bowl with bacon.
- Step 4 Scoop mixture into a 7x11 inch baking dish. Bake in the preheated oven 20 minutes, or until bubbly and lightly browned.

Ranger Mike has worked hard all winter to get our buildings looking great for summer. His big project this winter was to continue the interior renovations of Morris Lodge, and it is AMAZING! We completely rewired the electrical in the building, installed all new light fixtures, and finished the interior walls that have just been open studs since it was built in 1938. But don't worry - we're keeping the cool character of the building! And we can finally use the fireplace in Morris again! Due to changes in fire code, we have not been able to have a fire in there since the late 90s. This spring we installed an all new gas log insert, which


Camp registrations have been coming in fast and furious this year! We are completely full for most of our day camp slots, and overnight weeks are getting pretty full as well. We've capped our capacity at about 75% of our full capacity to allow for smaller groups and additional distance between camper beds. We also received a grant from the United Way of St. Joseph County to buy Abbott BinaxNow Rapid Tests so that we can test all of our campers and staff weekly. We currently have 928 campers registered for the summer! Our biggest summer ever was in 2019, when we had 1001 campers. I think, even with reduced capacity, that we may surpass that!





EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR

(AED) locations on Birch Lake



CALL 9-1-1



FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
