### Back to Birch! Stock the Bar Party, Saturday, June 26, 6:30 pm



# — Water Quality Report — Eurasian Milfoil

urasian Milfoil is an aggressive tall growing exotic aquatic plant from Europe and Asia. It can grow to the surface in up to 10 to 15 feet of water.

At the surface, it forms a dense canopy of vegetation over other plants. Many

# THE "SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species AIS)
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues

native plants may be reduced in abundance by Milfoil canopy. It also conflicts with many recreational activities. In dense conditions, it is a serious localized and lake wide problem. It is not a significant food crop for waterfowl, other birds or aquatic mammals. It readily regenerated from detached fragments and spreads rapidly. Consequently, this plant can form dense colonies covering much of a lake's shore line out to a depth of about 20 feet.

We began monitoring aquatic vegetation in Birch Lake in 2001. We were part of a Michigan Lake & Stream program that mapped the aquatic plants in Birch Lake. Howard Wandell provided professional assistance to the Birch Lake Water Quality Committee. The mapping project revealed that Birch Lake had a moderate plant population consisting of a good variety of species none of which dominated. At the time, the survey determined that we did not have Eurasian Milfoil.

In 2007 Eurasian Milfoil was discovered at three sites. Progressive AE provided professional assistance and is still under contract.

For 2021 Progressive AE surveyed the entire lake for all types of invasive species in mid-May. Their survey turned up a total of 3/4 acre of Eurasian Milfoil at two sites.



One on the east side in the usual location and one near the boat landing. Professional Lake Management treated the site on Monday June 14, 2021. Progressive AE will do a second survey.

The annual program is important to keep the Milfoil under control and to detect any other invasive species in the early stages to enable us to better control it. With your continued support, we can maintain this vital program. Our Water Quality fund is becoming dangerously low. Your continued financial support is greatly appreciated.

### Gypsy Moth infestation

Many of us on the west side have been infested with the Gypsy Moth. The Gypsy Moth caterpillars are high in the trees and continually drop black balls of poop, which are annoying, a pain to keep clean and making it almost impossible to enjoy the outdoors. The infestation goes from mild to severe, some trees have been totally stripped of all their leaves. Within the next two weeks the caterpillars will be moving on to the pupae (cocoon) stage. I have included two links of helpful information from Michigan State University about the life cycle of the Gypsy Moth. We hope this information helps others to be proactive, next year the infestation could be more wide spread and become worse before it gets better.



Please stop at the Weesner/Eshle-









# Camp Tannadoonah

ek Two is underway at Camp Tannadoonah - in fact, by the time you read this we'll be getting ready to send them all home! We have 100 campers here this week – 61 overnight and 39 day campers.

We have more day campers this summer than we have ever had before. In a "typical" (non Covid) summer, we have around 12 to 20 day campers each week. This summer, we have an average of 33 each week! Some of the kids are here for day camp all summer - we have a consistent group of about 15 who are here all, or most, of the sessions this summer.

It's Tuesday morning as I write this article, and today at camp – like every Tuesday – is Tie Dye Tuesday! We do a variety of different tie dye projects over the summer, including traditional tie dye, ice dye, reverse tie dye (where you use bleach on a dark shirt), and today they're using hot glue to draw patterns on their shirts before dying them. After you wash out the dye, you can peel the hot glue off and it leaves behind an undyed area on the fabric! It's always exciting to see the results of the kids' creativity!

Like many businesses, we have had a hard time finding enough staff this summer. In particular, we could use a few more college-age male counselors. If you know anyone (18 and older) who is

looking for summer work, send them our way! We would be happy to work around people's schedules, or have people who can only work a week or two.

Ranger Mike and Mr. Bill (my Dad) have been working on lots of projects around camp these past few weeks, including rebuilding the screened porch on the Nurse's cabin, and building a new porch by the staff lounge on Main Lodge. And they've been handling all the things that pop up around camp once we are back in full swing - water leaks, electrical problems, tree branches down, you name it!

I'd like to give a HUGE shoutout to Tom Mosier (east side), who helped us repair an underground water leak last week. He brought out equipment and manpower, and dug up the leaky pipe and repaired the problem for us at no cost to camp. We are so grateful for Tom's help anytime we have water issues at camp. Thank you Tom!

We're just over a week away from the return of the Pancake Breakfast at Camp Tannadoonah. Bring your family and friends out to camp Sunday morning, July 4 from 8:30-11 am, for an all-you-can-eat pancakes and sausage breakfast! Cost is \$5 for ages 10 and older; \$2 for ages 5-10, and free for kids 4 and younger. We will have outdoor seating options, and carry out options. All of our staff and volunteers working in





# FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

## IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
