Water Quality Report — 2022 lake E coli report

s was mentioned in last weeks Barker we have tested for E coli in the lake for the past 14 or so years following some resident's concerns after the installation of the sewer system. The first couple of years we employed a validated testing laboratory to actually come out and take samples and do the laboratory testing. Since there were no elevated levels of E coli beyond what might be expected in a natural environment (geese, ducks, swans, muskrats, washed in dog feces, and small children accidents), we decided to sample and analyze the samples for ourselves at considerably reduced costs in succeeding years.

The test materials were obtained from a testing laboratory and supply center in Goshen. This included sterile sampling bottles, petri dishes, and a nutrient agar that will show E coli colonies in dark blue due to a particular chemical reaction. An egg incubator was also obtained to hold the samples at 95 degrees, a temperature defined to facilitate the development of E coli colonies.

We also defined 5 testing sites and have taken the samples yearly from these same five sites. We measure E coli as that is considered an indicator bacteria for pollution and safety for water activities. Higher levels may not necessarily mean water is unsafe, but is an indicator that there may be other bacteria of danger or potentially mutated E coli that can lead to serious illnesses. Thus, when one reads of beach closures it is due to high levels of E coli, commonly as a result of runoff from combined sewer storm water drains after large rains, or big goose populations on a shoreline.

Again, this year the results show virtually no E coli from the samples taken. Three sites had no E coli colonies grow, and one site had a single colony from triplicate petri plates. The only sampling site where we have had high E coli levels is from the inlet stream in the northeast part of the lake.

Previously, E coli from this site has been genetically tested and is of non-human origin and thus not a sewer leak. Also, as we have demonstrated in the past, as well as this year, the E coli levels 20 feet away from the stream are





no more than any other part of the lake indicating an almost immediate dilution effect.

The bottom line is Birch lake is still the safe lake it has been for all water activities. Since there has been no issue with this test for the past 14 years, we may discontinue this testing in future years, unless we see a particular need to resume.

PS There is bacteria in the lake just as there is bacteria everywhere in all ecosystems. Remember you as individuals have 70 trillion (yes trillion) bacteria on the surface of your skin as well as in your alimentary tract.







¹/₄ cup shredded mozzarella cheese


Directions: Step 1 - Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Season with oregano, and salt and pepper to taste. Use a spoon to top each tomato slice with a small amount of the mayonnaise mixture. Sprinkle with Mozzarella , and then top with parsley.



Step 3 - Bake in preheated oven for approximately 15 minutes, or until golden brown.

Serve immediately.

An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.

4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
