Commodore's Comments August 20, 2022

unday, I finished my seventh consecutive day of sailing – the most I've done in one week. I taught five days of sailing lessons at Camp Tannadoonah, sailed in the Kidz Regatta on Saturday and sailed in three Sunday races. At Camp I had back-to-back classes for beginner sailors, and we used the Camp's Barnett 1400 sailboats. The kids were awesome: fun, willing to try something new and very polite and nice to each other. By the end of the week we had all bonded and were having fun just being together. The last day there was no wind so we discussed practicing tipping and turtling (where the boat's mast is pointing directly into the water and just the bottom of the boat is showing which looks like a turtle's shell) the boat close to shore. One young man told me he was still nervous about tipping so I said we should try to face his fears by breaking down what we were doing and why. We tipped and turtled numerous times. We even showed the other group of sailors what to do in a turtling situation. The water was warm, the sun was shining, and we all were having fun, even my nervous sailor was laughing and seemed to be gaining confidence. Teaching sailing has been a highlight of the summer and I hope to be able to assist again next summer as it brought me so much joy.

Friday evening, my husband Tom and I, along with some 15 other boats and a couple kayakers, gathered near Camp Tannadoonah's pier. At roughly 9:15 pm, as the skies were darkening, we could begin to see the glow of candlelight coming down the Camp's 87 steps (yes, I counted them going up one day), and the campers lined up along the piers and waterfront, the entire time singing camp songs. This was our first time experiencing the Candlelight Serenade, held the last night of camp for the summer. The parade down to the waterfront and the singing lasted about 30 minutes. All the candles reflected in the water, and it was a beautiful sight. After the program boaters honked their horns, clapped, and whistled in appreciation, which made the campers respond with their own hootin' and hollerin'. Thank you Camp Tannadoonah for sharing your lovely tradition with those from Birch Lake lucky enough to witness it.





# Purple Loosestrife on Birch Lake

he Birch Lake Water Quality Committee started the Purple Loosestrife Management Program in 2000. The Program has been very effective. In 2000 we had 10 sites located on all shores of the lake, some of which were very dense. We continue to monitor for Purple Loosestrife each year and remove the plants that we find. The Plants bloom from late June / early July until about the end of August. In early September they begin to drop their dried seeds. Hopefully all blooming plants have been removed by this time to prevent future growth next season.

If you see, or suspect you see the plant, please call Bruce Wagner, our Water Quality committee Purple Loosestrife Specialist (Cottage 269-476-2090 or Cell 574-286-7183) or any member of the Water Quality Committee to have it checked out.

This year Purple Loosestrife was removed or is in the process of being removed from two sites on Birch Lake. Typically, we find Loosestrife each year in three or four locations and the volume of plants at each site has diminished.

#### What is it?

Purple Loosestrife is a plant that was accidentally introduced to the United States and distributed as an ornamental. It is most easily identified during the flowering season. This spiked-shaped purple pinkish flower can be seen above the water level in ditches, streams, rivers, lakes and other moist shallow water sites. This plant is an upright hardy perennial four to eight feet tall and most often found in groups.

#### **Effects:**

Purple Loosestrife invades marshes, ditches and lake shores quickly replacing native wetland plants. These plants form dense stands that wildlife cannot use for food or cover.

#### Spread:

Purple Loosestrife will grow from the roots of an established plant, however the plants spread mainly by seed. Having up to 300,000 per stalk, these tiny seeds can live in the soil and water for many years and can be transported great distances by humans, animals and water.

#### **Management (Eradication)**

Once the plant becomes easily evident (in mid-July) but before it goes to seed (in early September), Specialist Wagner will slowly tour the lake in his pontoon boat and with binoculars searching for purple loosestrife, usually about four times per season. You will



recognize his pontoon boat by the Purple Loosestrife banner hanging on the side. If seen, he will later return from shore in waders and pull each plant (by its roots), bag and properly dispose of it and the Water Quality Committee will be notified of the plant's location.

In the MC fleet, Scott Troeger won all three; Pat Welch came in second in all three; Bill Luecht got two third places, and Phil Vitale one.





# BALSAMIC GRILLED ZUCCHINI

simple grilled zucchini recipe with a touch of balsamic vinegar, garlic, and Italian seasoning.


#### Ingredient:

- 2 zucchinis, quartered lengthwise
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 pinch salt
- 2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar

#### Directions:

- Step 1 Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-low heat and lightly oil the grate.
- Step 2 Brush zucchini with olive oil. Sprinkle Italian seasoning, garlic powder, and salt over zucchini.
- Step 3 Cook on the preheated grill until beginning to brown, 3 to 4 minutes per side. Brush balsamic vinegar over zucchini and continue cooking 1 minute more. Serve immediately.

# Camp Tannadoonah wrapped for the year

e've wrapped up Camp Tannadoonah 2022, and what a year it was! We finished the summer with a total of 1208 campers, a new season record. Last year we had 1111 at the end of the summer, so that's an 8.7% increase over our previous highest total.

We averaged 134 campers per week overall, including both day and overnight campers. Our Day Camp program was at 99.66 percent capacity for the summer we had 289 out of 290 spots for the summer filled! Our overnight program was 94 percent full for boys and 93 percent full for girls over the course of the summer. It was certainly a busy summer!

Now that staff have gone home (most of them, at least), we have a rental group here for the week. They bring all of their own staff and run nearly all of their own programs. It's a church group from Livonia, Michigan, from The Basilica of Saint Mary, an Antiochan Orthodox Church. They call their week at Camp Tannadoonah the "village up north."

This is the fourth time they've been here, but the first time since 2019 because of COVID. This year they only brought about 45 campers and have nearly 30 counselors and staff! The staff arrived Sunday afternoon to get everything ready, and their campers arrived on Monday around 1 pm.

You may have heard them from the lake when they arrived - the kids and staff were VERY excited! They were cheering and yelling and clapping, and one of the staff was introducing people over the loudspeaker. The kids had been on a bus for about three hours, so they were really energetic! Once they unloaded the bus, they had a dance party on the front lawn of the Dining Hall for 20 minutes or so.

Over the course of the week, they will be doing traditional camp activities like crafts and nature and archery, and they're planning to swim and go canoeing and kayaking and fishing. They also rented a pontoon boat so they can take pontoon cruises in the evening and take the kids tubing during the day. On Wednesday, Gabby and I will be leading a couple hours of teambuilding activities for their kids, and Kyle (who was our waterfront director this summer) will be lifeguarding for them in the afternoons.

Next week our after school program at Good Shepherd Montessori in South Bend starts back up on Monday, and the following week we start our before and after school program at Sam Adams Elementary in Cassopolis.

We have rental groups and events booked at camp for most of the weekends this fall, starting with a wedding the



weekend of August 27. We have a group from Spectrum Health doing a wilderness medicine event out here on August 30-31, a student retreat with a group from Notre Dame, a wedding shower, a reunion of ladies from another camp (Minnewonka Lodge in Minnesota), our 2nd Annual Grown Up Camp weekend, another wedding, and our Fall Family Camp Weekend! The last group finishes up the 2nd weekend of October. It will sure be a busy fall at camp!



# FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

## IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
