





Thanks to Pat Welch for alerting us to this device, the surface portion of which is floating in about 80' of water off of the west shore.

Apparently it was placed there by the DNR to measure and record temperatures and quantities of dissolved oxygen at various depths and at regular time intervals. It may be left in place for a number of months. This information indicates stratifications within the water column, used to help determine our status as a cold water lake.

This information is good.



Eurasian Milfoil

tall growing exotic aquatic plant from Europe and Asia. It can grow to the surface in up to 10 to 15 feet of water. At the surface, it forms a dense canopy of vegetation over other plants. Many native plants may be reduced in abundance by Milfoil canopy. It also conflicts with many recreational activities. In dense conditions, it is a serious localized and lake wide problem. It is not a significant food crop for waterfowl, other birds or aquatic mammals. It readily regenerated from detached fragments and spreads rapidly. Consequently, this plant can form dense colonies covering much of a lake's shore line out to a depth of about 20 feet.

We began monitoring aquatic vegetation in Birch Lake in 2001. We were part of a Michigan Lake & Stream program that mapped the aquatic plants in Birch Lake. Howard Wandell provided professional assistance to the Birch Lake Water Quality Committee. The mapping project revealed that Birch Lake had a moderate plant population consisting of a good variety of species none of which dominated. At the time, the survey determined that we did not have Eurasian Milfoil.

In 2007 Eurasian Milfoil was discovered at three sites. Progressive AE provided professional assistance and is still under contract.

For 2023 Progressive AE surveyed the entire lake for all types of invasive species

1 acre of Eurasian Milfoil on the east shore. They also found a small amount of Eurasian Milfoil on the North shore. On June 12th of this year, Professional Lake Management treated the site on the east shore. Progressive AE will do a second survey and determine whether further treatment will be peeded

The annual program is important to keep the Milfoil under control and to detect any other invasive species in the early stages to enable us to better control it. With your continued support, we can maintain this vital program. Your continued financial support is greatly appreciated.



The Six Commandments of Birch Lake Water Quality

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other **Water Quality issues**







Vanilla Pudding Fruit Salad

ne easiest fruit salad ever thanks to the addition of vanilla pudding mix! Make it for your next party and watch it disappear!

Prep Time 5 minutes; Total Time 5 minutes Ingredients:

3 to 4 cups fruit (I used 1 1/2 cups sliced strawberries

1 cup grapes

1/2 cup blueberries

1/2 cup pineapple)

1 to 2 tablespoons instant vanilla pudding mix (Jell-O brand is

About 2 tablespoons lemon or lime juice, optional

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract, optional

1/2 teaspoon almond extract, optional

Instructions

Add fruit to a large bowl. Sprinkle with 1 to 2 tablespoons instant pudding mix powder and toss to combine. Over time, the natural fruit juices moisten the pudding






powder. Or help it along with a splash of water.

Optionally add lemon or lime juice for a tangier fruit salad and toss to combine.

Optionally add vanilla or almond extract, or both, and toss to combine.

Serve immediately, or cover and refrigerate for up to 24 hours before serving. I prefer to make it and refrigerate overnight because the flavors marry and the coating tastes best.

Week 2 campers here; one week to pancakes

eek 2 campers are here, and it's actually our smallest session of the summer with only 80 campers! It's crazy to think that 80 is our smallest session, because my first summer as camp director (in 2006), our biggest session of the whole summer had 68 registrations. Right now, we're at 1154 registrations for the 2023 summer, with a goal of 1200; in 2006 we finished the summer with 351 total campers.

This week's theme is "Lights, Camera, Action!," and we have a theater program offered this week that campers can sign up for. The campers in that class spent Monday afternoon looking up skits and short plays, and decided on one to practice all week and perform on Friday for the rest of camp. Some of our evening programs this week are based on that theme as well – with a Variety Show one night, where campers and staff can show off their talents, and a Name that Tune activity one evening.

We have some new specialty programs this summer at camp that campers can sign up for. We have a new "Art Exploration" class, which is intended to be a more in-depth arts and crafts class, where campers can spend more time on a project that is a bit more complex than our typical handcraft activities. Some of the projects include experimenting with

watercolors, learning crocheting or knitting, glass etching, or needle felting.

Another new program this year is campcraft, which is defined as skill and practice in the activities relating to camping. In this class campers will learn knot-tying, plant identification, fire-building, how to set up a campsite, and planning a hike or trip. Many years ago, when I was a camper, campcraft was offered in addition to our traditional nature program. We've added it back this year to give campers an opportunity to learn outdoor skills.

We also added a class called Art in Nature, giving kids the opportunity to make art from found objects and items in nature. They may make nature impressions or rubbings, paint with dyes made from berries or leaves, create collages from collected nature items, etc. Other weeks we have an Art in Science class, using principles of science to make art. They may do pendulum painting, creating sand art using sound waves, and so forth.

We're also offering a basic water rescue class this year, which is another "throw back" to years ago. It's not a certification course, but an opportunity for older campers to learn water safety skills. Many years ago, Red Cross offered a certification in Basic Water Rescue (aka BWR), and it was offered at camp when I was a camper. The class will give campers



EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
