


Crockpot Challenge






















Water Quality Report -

Water Quality Report End of Season

What will follow will be Commandment #6: Thou Shalt Remain Informed About Other Important Water Quality Issue. As you will see this consists of ten precepts. However before getting to that, just a few additional remarks before the printed Barker is put to bed. As has been stated earlier, the Water Quality Committee expressed concern about the drop in our water quality as expressed by the Trophic Index, which is compiled from the testing we had conducted the previous year. See the attachment to the first Barker for all the data. In order to further evaluate any actions or recommendations, other than what we bring to you on a weekly basis, we need additional information. That will include this year's testing data, some additional tests that will be conducted by Progressive AE who survey the lake for invasive species, and the fisheries data as they evaluate the lake as a cisco fishery. All of this will provide a baseline of information to present to the lake community next spring as well as to have appropriate conversations with state and academic agencies.

And now Commandment # 6 1) None of the samples tested for e-coli in Birch Lake over the last 11 or more years have shown any more than expected background, and definitely not of concern. 2) The term "seaweed" has a negative connotation. This is unfortunate. A moderate amount of plant life in the lake is desirable and an integral part of good water quality. At Birch, we are blessed to have a wide diversity of native aquatic plants growing in the lake. However, should you cut or find cut vegetation, please remove from the lake.

3) Avoid swimming in, ingesting, or letting your pets drink from water in or nearby an algae bloom. Algae blooms are a rarity in Birch Lake. For further information please refer to an earlier Barker.

4) The effects of alcohol and certain medications are increased while on the water due to added stress factors such as sun, heat, wind, wave motion, and engine noise. Be safe.

5) 85 percent of drowning victims in the United States were not wearing a life jacket. They may seem dorky, but they do save lives.

6) Should the present method (donations) of financing our common interest of water quality become inadequate, our only option will be to ask our local governments to create, control, and ultimately make all decisions for, a special assessment district (S.A.D.). The costs for a SAD will be added to our tax bills. Thanks for everyone's past generosity. Let's pray that it continues and even grows (because expenses do). 7) Although we have some pretty good ideas, we do not know what or when the next invasive species will arrive in Birch Lake. Starry Stonewort has been discovered in the Mill Pond and is present is some nearby lakes. Tough invasive to manage, and expensive.

8) Except for the people living here, the lake is the most significant feature of our homes. The lake is our home. Take care of it.

9) The lake is shared possession and thus a shared responsibility. Make sure to contribute your time and talent to its maintenance and betterment.
10) The majority of the current WQ members have both served and lived for

members have both served and lived for lengthy periods. Fresh blood, if only for smooth future transitions, will soon be needed and will always be welcomed.

THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).

II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.

III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves. IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.

V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.

VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues

SW Michigan Interlake Regatta for Birch Lake in 2024?

Barb Cassady has been leading a committee to investigate the feasibility of holding the SW Michigan Interlake Regatta at Birch Lake in 2024, and the committee's report of its findings is on the agenda of the BLYC Board for its meeting of Saturday, September 9, 2023 at 9 am. As reported in this column last week, our friends at Corey Lake Yacht Club held this year's Interlake Regatta, which was Corey Lake's first regatta since 1982. Three BLYC Sailors participated, and learned a great deal by observing how our generous and friendly hosts at Corey Lake made their event a huge success. Everyone was very grateful to YMCA Camp Eberhart for making its beautiful lakefront available, as the public boat launch and parking facilities at Corey Lake were not suitable, so without the generosity of Camp Eberhart, the Regatta could not have been held at Corey Lake. (Here at Birch Lake, we are fortunate to have a suitable public boat launch, as well as sufficient parking at our yacht club and elsewhere.) Congratulations and thank you for a great regatta, friends at Corey Lake Yacht Club! We had a wonderful time, and hope to return the favor next year! Many thanks to John and Barb Kroggel of Corey Lake, as John kindly provided us with Barb Kroggel's beautiful photos of the Corey Lake SW Michigan Interlake Regatta. Her photos, two of which are seen below, may give you an idea of splendor of this year's regatta at Corey Lake, and of the beautiful sights that might be seen here at Birch Lake in 2024, God willing!

Three good races at Birch Lake on the last day of our regular season

In the MC Fleet, Barb Cassady won the first two races, but in her third race, she got a bad start and was in last place by quite some distance. However, she made a very impressive rally to finish 5th in the third race. Meanwhile, Scott Troeger went 2-2-1, and Pat Welch 5-2-3, while Bob King took 2nd place in the third race. Scott's season point average lead over Barb increased slightly to 30 points.

An unusual event occurred in the second MC race. Scott and Pat Welch were

neck-and-neck to the finish line. The front of Pat's boat crossed the line first, which normally means a win. But then part of Pat's boat hit the orange buoy before the rear of his boat crossed the line. Pat wisely took a provisional penalty by dropping back below the line, doing a 360 degree turn, and crossing the line again before the fourth boat arrived. Tom Cassady consulted his rule book and found a specific rule which held that Scott had won second place, and Pat third place, so Pat's provisional action preserved his third place finish. We don't believe that any of us had ever seen this happen before.

In the Sunfish Fleet, Rick Russwurm now leads Stewart Spratt by a slightly less slim margin of only 33 season average points, after Rick went 2-1-1 to Stewart's 3-2-3. Meanwhile, Bob Niezgodski held to a favorable wind on the left side of the course to win the first race of the day, followed by a 3rd and a 2nd place finish, proving once again that he is becoming a force to be reckoned with.

With only the five races of the Labor Day Regatta remaining in our season, the race for the season championship is a nail-biter in both of our Fleets, and anything can happen!

And in other water sports, I went waterskiing today. My father-in-law Jack Hornbeck waterskiied on Birch Lake every year until age 75. I'm aiming to break his record in four more years, and then keep on going. He would have enjoyed that. Wie! \sim F.C. Steve



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- 5. South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

 CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
 Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
 An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.

4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.

The Cassopolis Post Office has contacted us about the Barker being delivered in mailboxes, warning us that delivery of any items that do not have postage to mailboxes is illegal, and that if we continue using mail boxes, we will be fined.

Some lake residents have told carriers they do not want Barkers piling up in doors, as it gives the look of an empty home and increases the possibility of a break-in. Nonetheless, the delivery team has been instructed to NOT deliver in or on mailboxes, but to find an alternative.

Vic Jones (east side) has placed a box in his driveway (see photo) for residents who haven't made arrangements for deliver to pick up their own Barkers ... Many residents have attached a length of PVC pipe (see photo above) to their mailbox stand for delivery. 



Spinach salad with peaches and pecans

his peach salad with baby spinach and roasted pecans is perfect for summer.

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Arrange pecans on a single



layer on a baking sheet and roast in preheated oven until they just begin to darken, about 7 to 10 minutes. Remove from oven and set aside.

Peel peaches (if desired) and slice into bite-sized segments. Combine peaches, spinach, and pecans in a large bowl.

Toss with dressing until evenly coated, adding a little additional dressing, if necessary.


