



(Just in time for a new microwave and air conditioner). This is an outstanding achievement!

ERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these de-vices are located at the following locations (see map):

- West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
 North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046

- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr. South/East Shore, Troeger home, South/East Sho 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

EMERGENC

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately. 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.

— Water Quality Report —

Trash talk ...


ive A Hoot, Don't Pollute!" Some of us are old enough to remember this public service announcement back in the 60's and 70's that was plastered on highway billboards and television commercials that featured a wise owl. Or the Native American standing at a shoreline filled with trash with a tear running down his cheek. There were stiff fines for littering. Hopefully those messages back then came across loud and clear.

Today you will see Adopt a Highway programs and a few random No Littering signs here and there. For the most part people seem to be more aware of litter and pollution than they did years ago. Birch Lake residents show a lot of pride in our beautiful water and are likely not the problem when trash is found in our lake. Unfortunately, it still exists.

Some of the items that have been found on our shores include glass bottles/broken glass, cans, plastic water bottles, plastic bags, remnants of fireworks, dead fish (either by mother nature or discarded), fishing lures/hooks, lead fishing sinkers, discarded fishing line, food/bait containers, and plastic rings from 6-packs.

Discarded fishing line, hooks and lead weights are a huge problem in every lake. If you've ever had a fishhook stuck in your skin, you know the feeling! These items are very harmful to waterfowl including loons, ducks, swans, and our beloved bald eagles. Fishing line and hooks can get tangled in their wings, around their necks, making them unable to fly. The same goes for plastic rings from 6-packs. They pose a big strangulation hazard. Make sure to cut them up into pieces before discarding into the garbage. Birds commonly eat small pebbles to grind food for digestion. Small lead sinkers and jigs may be mistaken for these pebbles and when ingested, the lead is absorbed into the bloodstream causing birds to become weak, unable to fly, vulnerable to predators and often die within two to three weeks after eating the lead. Just one lead sinker can poison a water bird. If you have lead fishing tackle in your box, please consider substituting it for non-lead material, such as tungsten.

A member of our Water Quality committee is working to get signage up at the boat launch for lead warning as well as a disposal tube for discarded fishing line. If you do see any waterfowl in distress, it is best to contact the local DNR customer service office located in Plainwell, MI at 269-



685-6851. With the recent outbreak of avian bird flu, it is recommended that you not handle any bird directly without protective mask and clothing. Our resident Michigan Loon Preservation Association loon ranger, Cindy Bernaciak (773-401-9191) is also available with links to licensed Michigan rehabilitators.

The Water Quality Committee is doing everything it can to keep our beautiful lake free of invasive species, managing scientific data, water transparency and pollution. As lake residents, please do YOUR part in keeping our lake pristine for generations to come. Take a little time each week, grab your water shoes (and the kids for a teachable moment) and comb your shoreline especially after a storm or the 4th of July festivities, for unwanted litter and dispose of it properly.

On a side note, the Purple Loosestrife (invasive plant) season starts next month. You will see our committee member/Loosestrife expert Bruce Wagner doing his plant inspections along with others from the committee who will be learning alongside him. We are working hard for YOU! Clean water is the main reason we are all able to swim, play and enjoy our little piece of paradise we call home.

Memories from Scannell/Hogobooms

ois Scannell painted the picture (on the front page of this Barker) of Breece's a.k.a. Lankey's, most likely in the 1960's. She started painting in her 60s, and taught water-color through the YMCA in South Bend well into her 90s.

Lois & John brought their 3 kids to Birch Lake every summer starting in 1939 when they rented the Douglas cottage on the south side (the cottages is now owned by Mike and Paula Russell).

That year, they decided to purchase the property next door, and began building their cottage. They chose Birch Lake because it is so clean.

Pat Scannell Hogoboom was 10 years old when the cottage was built. She remembers that Lankey would cut blocks of ice out of the lake in the winter and store them. In the summer, they were sold to the residents for their iceboxes (refrigerators before they were electric).

Other memories of Birch Lake include walking around the lake daily; moms and kids together. Pat's brothers John and Bob would swim across the lake. Lois and John would row their boat out to the middle of the lake in the evening and watch the sunset.

One of the big reasons for bringing the family to Birch Lake for the summer

was to get the kids out of the city, and away from polio. The fear was so real, that one year a county sheriff came to the cottage and told John his kids couldn't be in the water because of the polio. John told the officer, "You and I both know that polio is not being spread through the lake." But to keep the peace, he kept the kids out of the water that summer.

Pat remembers there was a Conservation Office at the Yacht Club, and one year the young officer fell in love with one of the local girls. Pat and the younger teenage girls were asked to be part of the wedding. She remembers they all wore matching sweaters.

The Scannell cottage has been a honeymoon haven. Pat and her husband Dave came to Birch for their Honeymoon. They sent a postcard of the lake to their parents saying, "Glad you are not here."

Their son Dave and his wife Donna came to Birch as did their son Joe and his new wife Kate. Dave and Terry Carroll rented the cottage for their honeymoon. Two years ago, Patrick and Nicki Russell stayed there after they were married, and soon Pat's granddaughter Katee will bring her new husband here after their wedding at the end of July.

The Scannell/Hogoboom memories continue with Pat's great-grandkids loving their time at the family cottage and next door at the Lake House where Dave and Donna now spend their summers.







Here are some of the things the committee has done:

- Spring of 2024 we worked with the local farmer to stop runoff into the lake.
- Worked with the Cass County Park Department to repair the boat landing. Coordination between all of the entities took time and there may be more to do in the future but the work has given us better launching and loading of our boats.
- No Powerloading sign at the landing. Please remember not to powerload your boat onto your trailer. This is when you gun your motor so your boat is thrust onto the trailer. This has caused a large crater at the end of the ramp. We have also been in contact with the pier companies and requested that they do not powerload their boats and equipment
- Alerted the authorities about the condition of the parking lot at the land-
- While we do not agree with the Park Department (and are on record as saying so) installing a Port-a-Potty at the landing from Memorial Day to after Labor Day we were able to get them to enclose the unsightly item on 3 sides.
- We continue to monitor state, county, township and local laws and

recommendations that might affect our property values. Members of the HOA and other residents of the lake sit on local boards and report back.

Some of the topics and items we regularly monitor include:



— Camp Tannadoonah —

he Pancake Breakfast at Camp is this Sunday, July 7, from 8:30-11am. The cost is \$5 for ages 13 and older, \$3 for youth ages 5-12, and free for ages 0-4. Please come out and support Camp T and have a great breakfast. We will have pancakes (and gluten free pancakes), sausage links, fruit cocktail, coffee, orange juice, and milk.

I did a bit of research on the Pancake Breakfast by digging through old Barkers. Thank you to Bill Luecht for providing me with digital copies of all the old Barkers from 1944 through 2017!

The first Birch Lake Pancake breakfast took place in 1986, the morning following the fireworks. It was held at the Yacht Club that first year and served by the BLYC officers and board members. It's been held on the Sunday morning following the fireworks ever since.

That would make this year the 28th Pancake Breakfast (we skipped 2020). The chairperson the first year was Nancy Walker (west shore, where Sheffiecks live now). I've included a photo (shown below) of the announcement in the Barker about the first year of this event. In the Barker following the event, they reported that they served about 175 people.

The breakfast outgrew the Yacht Club and was moved to the Camp Tannadoonah

Dining Hall in 1989. The Walkers chaired the breakfast from 1986 through 1990. Buzz and Linda Rasmussen (west shore) coordinated the event in 1991. In 1992, Marty and Doris Sante (south shore) took over the event and were the chairs from 1992-1996. Sue Wagner (cove) chaired the breakfast in 1997.

In 1998, Don and Lind Harman (east shore) took over the event in 1998. They coordinated the breakfast from 1998 through 2011, and I think for many of us on the lake, we think of this as Don and Lind's event. Over the years, the number of people served at the breakfast grew from around 175 to over 580 in 2008! I believe that was a record crowd that has not been matched since.

In 2009, Phil and Sandy Vitale (east shore) and Mike and Amy Lutz (north shore) began chairing the breakfast and continued the tradition through 2016. In 2017 it looked like the breakfast might be canceled because we didn't have anyone to lead the event, so the camp staff and board of directors took over the event and has been coordinating it since.

Last year, in 2023, we served a total of 395 people. We'd love to see those numbers get back up into the 400s or even 500s! The proceeds from the breakfast go to our scholarship fund to send campers to camp, and



the more we raise, the more we are able to help families who would not otherwise be able to send their kids to a session of camp.

This year we have a great crew of camp staff, board members, camp alumni, and Birch Lake neighbors helping us set up, cook, serve, and clean up from the event. Miss Gabby will also have the Camp Trading Post open, so you can get all the new Camp T apparel on Sunday morning. While you're here, you can also check out the four brand new cabins we built this spring!
