





— Water Quality Report —

Commandment #2

Tou shalt minimize surface runoff ...

... It has often been said that whatever is around a lake eventually gets into the lake. Unfortunately, that is typically true. This is especially problematic when our lake takes some fifteen years to fully drain and replenish itself. Even worse, many of the most objectionable substances settle to the bottom and are not likely to ever leave.

So, what's a concerned, water quality advocate/lake homeowner like yourself, to do? We're glad you asked!

1) Know that the fewer areas hard surfaced like buildings, sidewalks and pavements help to reduce water run off into the lake. The greater the distance between the hard surface areas and the lake equates to less water running into the lake. This is very important because runoff often carries undesirable chemicals and objects.

2) Before landscaping an area and disturbing the earth, you might be required to obtain a "Soil and Sedimentation Control Permit." Obviously, this pertains to large landscaping projects rather than a small garden. But if it's a large enough project it might require installing a silt fence between the disturbed area and the shoreline to capture and contain runoff. We recently had an incident where a farmer clear cut many trees on the east side above the boat landing to yield more farmland. Unfortunately, those same trees and the contour of the land provided a natural flow into the ravine below where the water eventually filtered into the aquifer. By altering the landscape, the new water path from the farmland found its way onto Birch Road, down the newly paved boat launch and into our beautiful lake. It was a brown river of farm silt including the chemicals and fertilizer that comes with it. Fortunately, a concerned lake resident brought it to the attention of the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Department of the Cass County Conservation District, who engaged the farmer to remedy the situation. The farmer, unaware of the problem, quickly created a berm to re-route the water path back into the ravine where it once again was naturally filtered into the aquifer. To his credit, the farmer didn't hesitate to fix the problem once it was brought to his attention, and the potential crisis was averted. Many thanks to all who were involved.

3) Capturing water and piping it directly into the



lake isn't the best way to re-route water. That way only increases the water's velocity and doesn't give suspended solids a chance to be filtered out before finding the lake. Instead, consider draining the water into a dry well which will allow the water to be filtered by the soil before it enters the aquifer and eventually the lake.

4) Although better than hard surfaced areas, lawns don't do much to slow down or filter runoff. A barrier strip of thick, rooted native plants at and above the shoreline really helps to slow down and filter runoff. A 6' wide minimum barrier is desirable. Even better, if it's 2-3 feet in height it will help to keep geese off your property (they like to be able to see the lake).

5) At all times, remove and dispose of any objects that are likely to damage our lake. Examples are oils, fuels, fertilizers, feces (goose or other), ashes, leaves, trash and grass clippings.

Overall, whenever planning to develop, modify, rebuild or just improve your home or property – keep Commandment #2 in mind. In other words, let your kids and grandkids be the only things that runoff into our lake.

The Birch Lake Cemetery

have spent many years doing genealogy research and have walked through more cemeteries than I can count and have some crazy stories to along with them. My research led me to Birch Lake Cemetery one day, and it has captivated my heart ever since!

It is where some of my friends and neighbors are buried. It's where I taught my grandchildren to love and respect the hallowed ground and the tombstones within. Even though the cemetery has seen its share of damage from Mother Nature and acts of vandalism throughout the years, this cemetery is a lovely well-maintained and historic cemetery. If you look carefully around the cemetery grounds it has stories to tell, you may even find the old Buggy trail that wound through the cemetery.

The land for the cemetery was donated by James East. The Easts were members of the Society of Friends or Quakers who came to Calvin Township in 1833. They were some of the first settlers in Calvin and Porter Townships.

The original name of the cemetery was called Friends Cemetery, later it was known as East Cemetery and finally named Birch Lake Cemetery.

The cemetery sits across the street from the land where the Quakers in 1837 built a log cabin to be used for community worship, the log cabin was later replaced in 1856. The building known as the Birch Lake Meeting House was used for community worship. Many all-day picnics by the congregation were held and members would take the pews outside and spend the day conversing and eating while the children played across the street in the cemetery, home of their loved ones. In 1966 the Birch Lake Meeting house was torn down due to disuse and vandals. Today only a historical marker remains at the site.

Many of the people buried here

were Quakers who played an important part in the Underground Railroad. They were instrumental in helping free slaves during the infamous Kentucky Raid of 1847 when slave catchers from Kentucky came searching for "their" slaves. They attacked several Quaker farms in Cass County while searching for the runaway slaves. Local history tells us that the wagon the Kentuckians brought with them to return the slaves to Kentucky was seized and pushed into Birch Lake by many very outraged people who lived in this area. In 1957 several wagon wheels were spotted in the lake, but it wasn't till a few years ago when a dive team retrieved some of those wheel remnants. Researchers found those artifacts. retrieved from Birch Lake to be those from the slave trader's wagon.

On the North end of the cemetery there is a large site of unmarked graves of African Americans slaves who made the journey north. Their names remain unknown. I'd heard this story many years ago and was able to find articles backing up those stories. One such article can be found in a 2003 edition of the Benton Harbor Herald Palladium.

Birch Lake cemetery is the final resting place for politician James O'Dell

of Cassopolis who was a captain in the War of 1812. He was a miller by trade and built the O'Dell Mill near Vandalia. He was a delegate to the state constitutional convention in 1835. He served in the first and third sessions of the Michigan House of Representatives.

Today the oldest readable tombstone in the


cemetery is that of John East who died in 1836


The land owned by the Birch Lake Quakers was eventually "laid down" in 1927 and the land reverted to the Indiana Yearly Meeting who later deeded the land to Birch Lake Cemetery Association with the provision: "It is understood that the property is to be kept in repair and used for religious meetings for the spiritual betterment of the community."

Birch Lake Cemetery located at 62307 James Road, in Calvin Township, Vandalia, MI is just a short 10-minute drive from Birch Lake by car. From the intersection of Walnut Rd. and Brownsville Rd., follow Brownsville Road West till you come to James Rd. Turn right or north, and go down the dirt road for about a mile, and as you come up the hill you will find the cemetery to your (right) west side of the road and the historical marker for the Meeting House can be found across the street on the east side of the road.
