





There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- 5. South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- **6. Southwest Shore**, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

### IN AN EMERGENCY:

- CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
   Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit. TAKE IT TO THE
- ange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.





# — Water Quality Report —

# The effects of high water levels

I igh water levels in lakes can have many negative effects including shoreline erosion, flooding and property damage. During high water levels, like we've been experiencing for the past couple of weeks, controlling man-made waves and wakes is essential to the well-being of our shorelines and shallow areas of the lake.

While we cannot control the waves made by Mother Nature, it's certainly possible to limit some of the wave damage caused by our boats.

Waves tend to stir up the lake bottom. If significant, they free up and raise into the water column one of its most undesirable possessions – phosphorus. That newly suspended phosphorus enhances turbidity (makes the water cloudier) and increases the phosphorus loading in the lake – which directly affects the growth of all plants and other organisms in the lake, especially algae. Stirring up the lake bottom can also cause the destruction of native aquatic plants by breaking them off at, or pulling them out by, their roots. High water lake levels only

enhance this process.

So, please refrain from making large waves and/or accelerating too fast if your prop wash results in the disturbance of the lake bottom. This is especially true when we have water levels like we've experienced the past two weeks.

When operating your boat at wake speed, constantly plot your course to assure you stay the required minimum distance from all shorelines and docks. According to Michigan state law, 100' is the minimum. As we've noted in earlier columns, it's recommended that wake boats maintain a minimum of 500' and



the wake wave should always be in the direction of the middle of the lake.

Most certainly, the lake water level will decrease to normal levels this summer. But in the meantime, be mindful of the effects that high-water levels can have on our lake bottom and shorelines.

If all this information is too much, just remember the old signs you'd see at boat launches and marinas, "You are responsible for your wake!"

# — Birch Lake Memories -

# The history of Zimmy's Tavern

arlier this summer, Pat Williams (south side) gave me a book about the area more south of us, particularly Baldwin, Prairie, and the lakes that make up that region. After reading it I concluded that most of the information would be found more interesting to residents of Baldwin, Long and Indian Lakes, but not so much for our group here at Birch. However, after reading again about Zimmyville and in particular Zimmy's Tavern, I thought Birch Lakers might be interested in reading about a business that most of us have been to at least once in our years here at Birch.

In the early 1940s, the land on the north side of little Baldwin Lake was owned by Fred and Lena Percy. Along with a concrete-block home, they built an adjoining tavern, which they named Percy's Tavern. Shortly thereafter a man named Harold "Zimmy" Zimmerman, a bachelor from South Bend, moved to what he called "Bachelor's Haven" on Carter Lake. Harold considered buying the business from Percy to open up his own enterprise. It is documented that when he was considering buying the business, he asked a friend who also thought of buying the business. Zimmy said." What will I use (to buy it)? bottle caps?" His friend replied, "That was what I was going to use." Harold beat him to it, and the rest is history. Harold "Zimmy" Zimmerman bought the tavern from Percy in the early 1940s. He began building the present tavern in the fall of 1945 and Zimmy's Tavern officially opened April 1946. Whether he used Bottle caps or real money for the original purchase is not known. Zimmy was known for his strength and zest for life. His friend said people would be leaning against the bar with the whole room

quiet until Zimmy walked in and the place would start to hop. It is told that once a woman who lived at the trailer park in the vicinity, thought her baby drowned in Long Lake, and ran across the road to Zimmy's carrying the child. Zimmy did some CPR and revived the baby. However, he always said her jostling the baby as she ran had a lot to do with the child's recovering.

Zimmy belonged to many clubs and organizations, and was one of the founding fathers of the Cass County Conservation Club. He played the accordion and appeared in many concertinas in the CCCC. He composed songs such as "Zimmy's polka" and "Sweethearts again."

He was said to have placed a wooden deer on US 12 as a joke, and fooled a few hunters into taking shots at the defenseless deer. Once when going up north, he was stopped for speeding, and said "You're not going to give me a ticket officer, are you?" The policeman said, "Why shouldn't I?" Zimmy replied, "Because I've got enough already!"

In the early days, Zimmy's Tavern was known for its Friday night fish

fries, and for pot lucks. Fishermen brought buckets of smelt for the big fish fry every year.

Although I don't remember it, when we lived on Baldwin Lake I was told that my father used to take me up to Zimmy's and sit me on the bar after he'd come back from working at Notre Dame. I was

just a toddler. That same bar is still standing in Zimmy's front room. It's no wonder that I have a soft spot in my heart for the old bar.

I remember bringing some of my college and Birch Lake friends to Zimmy's to experience the place. There are many stories that are told about that evening, who knows how many of them are true, but I do remember throwing toilet paper out the women's bathroom for some reason. Weird right??


Zimmy lived to be 95. The business area around Zimmy's Tavern is called Zimmyville, and Zimmy painted its name on the barn siding on the southwest corner of Sunset and US 12.

He joked that it was a contest to see which one would last longer, him or the barn. Always a jokester, in his final days he said it appeared to be a tie.

The bar changed hands a few times but still remains a favorite in this area. "Zimmy's celebrated its 75th anniversary a few years back, and it will hopefully be around for many more years.



# — Camp Tannadoonah —

# Camp accreditation visit

ast week I had the opportunity to spend a day visiting another camp in Michigan for their American Camp Association (ACA) accreditation. The ACA organization accredits camps across the country – including Camp Tannadoonah – to ensure that everyone is following standards and meeting expectations for quality programming, training, staffing, and policies at their camps. Each accredited camp completes an annual document review to ensure compliance, and every 5 years we have an in-person visit from a team of accreditation visitors.

All of the accreditation visits for camps are done by a team of volunteers who have been trained in the standards and have experience with accreditation at their own camps. Each year, I visit two to three other camps for their accreditation process. It's always interesting to visit other camps and learn how they do things and see their programs in action!

There is a long list of standards that everyone must meet in order to maintain their ACA Accredited Status, and they fall into 7 categories: Core/Foundational Standards, Administration, Facilities, Health and Wellness, Staff Qualifications Training and Supervision, Program Design and Activities, and Aquatics. We

have a collection of binders full of written explanations, documents, certificates, checklists, and other information to share with our ACA visitors.

Each time I visit another camp, I come back with so many ideas and things I want to try at Camp T. The camp I visited last week was Sherman Lake YMCA Outdoor Center in Augusta, Michigan, about an hour away from us near Gull Lake. Their current Executive Director was the Executive Director for Camp Eberhart a few years back, so it was fun to reconnect with him, too.

They have a beautiful property that is really unique. Unlike most Y camps, they're not affiliated with any local YMCA. They're an independent Y camp that was built on the site of a former boy scout camp. They told us they're the only one like this in the country. They serve approximately the same number of overnight campers as we do, with a capacity of 160 per week (ours is 152). But their day camp program is FAR larger than ours. In a typical week at Camp T, we have 25-40 day campers; they serve 200 day campers every week! As a result, their staff is much larger than ours with over 100 summer camp staff compared to our 35 or so.

I came back to camp with ideas for



next summer's staff training, some new program ideas, a new system for organizing our accreditation and licensing documents, and pictures of some activity areas and storage solutions they use at their programs that I want to try. One of the great things about the ACA accreditation process is the opportunity to learn from other camps, and every camp I've ever visited has been willing to share their documents, program information, and let us take pictures of things we thought would be useful to take back to our own camp.
