— Water Quality Report —

The red tide at Birch?

ue to its depth and limited inlets and outlets, it takes 15 years to drain and replenish all the water in Birch Lake. Whatever we let into our lake will be there for a very long time. So, our need to ward off the entry of undesirables, primarily phosphorus, is crucial.

Phosphorus is a chemical element required for all forms of life. It is also the limiting factor in most aquatic ecosystems. This means it is the variable in which a small change in its quantity will directly cause a substantial change in the growth of plants and algae. It can enter the lake from natural sources or human activities. The natural source is simply phosphorus dissolving from surrounding rock into the lake water. Humans create phosphorus through farm runoff, seeping septic systems and especially fertilizer that contains phosphorus.

Once phosphorus enters a lake, it's usually in the inorganic form of orthophosphate which is dissolved into the water. Once it's taken up by algae and aquatic plants, it becomes particulate phosphorus. As grazers eat the algae and predators eat the grazers, the phosphorus moves through the food web and is converted to organic phosphorus.

When large amounts of phosphorus enter the lake (through human activity) algae can reproduce rapidly, which can tint the water green and create slimy mats on the surface. Thus, the dreaded algal bloom which, at best, can be a significant nuisance for swimmers and boaters. It also degrades the conditions that fish, bugs, wildlife, and desired plants need to thrive. At its worst case, it can fuel a toxic blue-green algal bloom which is harmful to people and pets. Essentially, excess phosphorus can set off a vicious cycle of reducing desirable plant life which leads to reduced oxygen levels which in turn degrades the habitat for fish and other life. It's also difficult to reverse this chain of events. Need another example? Look no further than the affects of the "Red Tide" in Southwest Florida – an explosive algal bloom created by scheduled water discharges from Lake Okeechobee which travel down the Caloosahatchee River picking up farm runoff and fertilizer along the way and eventually emptying this super charged water into the Gulf of Mexico. The result: massive fish kills, irritated eyes and lungs, unusable beaches and warnings to stay out of the water.

We're not suggesting a Red Tide type of event will happen at Birch Lake. But it is incumbent on all of us to reduce the chances of increased phosphorus levels at our lake. In addition to constant monitoring by your Water Quality Committee, here's how you can act against an increase in phosphorus levels:

- 1) Consider not using any fertilizer on your property.
- 2) If you must fertilize, make sure the fertilizer does not contain any phosphorus.
- 3) Fertilize away from the shoreline.
 - 4) Never put ashes into the lake.
- 5) Never rake or blow leaves or other vegetation into the lake.
- 6) Pick up and properly dispose of animal waste.
- 7) Never feed the ducks, swans or geese.
- 8) Plant a barrier strip between your lawn and the shoreline, as wide as possible. Ideally use deeply rooted native plants at least 12"-24" tall.
- 9) Consider not using any weed killer on your property.
- 10) If you haven't done so, donate to the Water Quality Program to ensure testing, assessment and especially treatment of lake conditions is fully funded.

Northeast corner of Birch Lake

s we boat around Birch Lake, we take in the lovely homes and cottages along the shoreline. We know that many of the cottages were built by the settlers in the early 1900s but did you know that our lake was once home to two camps on the North Shore of the lake. In those early years, the north east corner of our lake was mostly forest with only a few cottages along it's shoreline.

In 1951, Virginia Gardner of Mishawaka, Indiana, as director of the Mishawaka branch of Campfire girls, purchased the acreage in the northeast corner of Birch to run a summer resident camp.

Named Camp Kiloqua, the camp was the second Campfire camp to be located here.

The camp was purchased from an Elkhart organization in 1951 and grew to be a thriving Campfire camp over the 19 years it operated. Improvements were made over the years and the operation hosted groups of Campfire girls for six weeks over the summer session. Campers enjoyed the clear blue waters of Birch Lake with swimming and canoeing available for their entertainment.








As young Birch Lakers, we used to walk through the camp on our nightly trips around the lake. Rumors have it that some of our young men would sneak up to the cabins and try to befriend female counselors. Don't know if any were successful however.

The large swim pier and boat launch were enjoyed by Birch Lake youth in the off-season as the bottom with sandy and weed free. With two camps anchoring

the east and west end of the North Shore, we fellow Lakers enjoyed the peace and solitude that the natural setting provided. All was calm until 1970 when rumors began of the camp shutting it's







Best fried green tomatoes

Serve these crispy fried green tomatoes outside with a glass of iced tea on a warm summer night and enjoy the sunset with someone you love!

Prep Time: 5 mins Cook Time: 15 mins Total Time: 20 mins Servings: 4

Ingredients

- 4 large green tomatoes
- 2 large eggs
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ cup cornmeal
- ½ cup bread crumbs
- 2 teaspoons coarse kosher salt
- ¼ teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 quart vegetable oil for frying

Directions

Gather all ingredients. Slice to matoes 1/2 inch thick. Discard the ends.

Whisk eggs and milk together in a medium-sized bowl. Scoop flour onto a plate. Mix cornmeal, bread crumbs, salt, and pepper on another plate. Dip tomatoes into flour to coat. Then dip tomatoes into milk and egg mixture; dredge in bread-crumbs to completely coat.

Heat oil in a large deep skillet to 375 degrees F (375 degrees). Place tomatoes in hot oil in batches of 4 or 5, to prevent them from touching; fry until crisp and golden brown on one side, then flip and fry on other side.

Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate to drain. Repeat with remaining tomatoes. Serve hot and enjoy!

Biggest week of campers - EVER!

e'll be wrapping up Session seven when you are reading this article. This week we have 176 campers in camp – our biggest week so far this summer, AND our biggest week ever! The four new cabins this year gave us an additional 16 beds, bringing our typical overnight capacity up from 137 to 153. This week we have all but two of those overnight beds filled, plus 25 day campers. The big weeks when camp is full are always fun. The energy level (and the noise!) increases greatly.

At lunch, when all of the day campers are here, the dining hall is completely full to capacity, and one group of staff is eating out on the front porch! If we want to continue to expand in the future, the next project we will need to tackle is increasing the capacity for seating at meals. We've talked about several ways to go about this. In the short term, the most likely solution would be to enclose the front porch and add tables out there.

Next week we will have just as may campers for the last session – maybe even one or two more! The last week of camp is always a special one. There are traditions around the last week that make it unique. On Friday night, August 9, we will have our candlelight serenade at the lake. Around 9 pm on Friday eve-

ning, the campers and staff will proceed down the waterfront stairs carrying candles and singing "Follow the Gleam." They will assemble around the dock at the waterfront and place their candles in the water while we sing. This candlelight serenade marks the closing of our camp season each year.

If you're at the lake on Friday night (August 9), be sure to come out on your boat for the serenade! We will be starting down the stairs around 9 pm, and we usually conclude around 9:40 pm. It's a beautiful way to end the season at camp, and we love when we see a crowd on the water to listen and watch!

In the 19 summers since I became the camp director in 2006, we've only had to cancel the serenade one time. In 2012 a tree fell on the waterfront stairs during rest hour on the very last day of camp, and we were unable to use the stairs. We were very lucky that it happened during rest hour when everyone was safely in their cabins. We rebuilt the entire stairway before the start of the 2013 camp season.

One other year we didn't cancel the serenade, but it was very memorable. The campers and staff started down the stairs with their candles. The tradition is that the camp director and assistant director stand at the top of the stairs and



light each candle from their own candle. Then the director and assistant director are the last two people to proceed down the stairs. Miss Michelle and I were about half way down the stairs when it suddenly started to rain. Not just a sprinkle, but a total downpour! We continued down the stairs because most of the campers were already at the bottom. We lined up on the pier and sang in the pouring rain. Most of the candles were extinguished, and we were all completely soaked, but everyone was laughing and

singing and having fun nonetheless. Hopefully this year we have clear skies and no rain next Friday night! Don't forget – Friday, August 9, at approximately 9 pm.
