



# — Water Quality Report —

### Purple Loosestrife on Birch Lake

he Birch Lake Water Quality
Committee started the Purple
Loosestrife Management Program in 2000. The Program has been
very effective. In 2000 we had 10 sites
located on all shores of the lake, some
of which were very dense. We continue
to monitor Purple Loosestrife each year
and remove the plants that we find. The
Plants bloom from late June / early July
until about the end of August. In early
September they begin to drop their
dried seeds. Hopefully all blooming
plants have been removed by this time
to prevent future growth next season.

If you see, or suspect you see the plant, please call Bruce Wagner, our Water Quality committee's Purple

Loosestrife Specialist (Cottage 269-476-2090 or Cell 574-286-7183) or any member of the Water Quality Committee to have it checked out. This will be Bruce's last year with the Purple Loosestrife program after serving for 24 years. Many thanks go to Bruce. The program would not have been a success without his dedication.

So far this year, Purple Loosestrife was located at two sites.

#### What is it?

Purple Loosestrife is a plant that was accidentally introduced to the United States and distributed as an ornamental. It is most easily identified during the flowering season. This spiked-shaped purple pinkish flower can be seen above the water level in ditches, streams, rivers, lakes and other moist shallow water sites. This plant is an upright hardy perennial four to eight feet tall and most often found in groups.

#### **Effects:**

Purple Loosestrife invades marshes, ditches and lakeshores quickly replacing native wetland plants. These plants form dense stands that wildlife cannot use for food or cover.

#### Spread:

Purple Loosestrife will grow from the roots of an established plant, however the plants spread mainly by seed. Having up to 300,000 per stalk, these tiny seeds can live in the soil and water for many years and can be transported great distances by humans, animals and water.

#### **Management (Eradication)**

Once the plant becomes easily evident (in mid-July) but before it goes to seed (in early September), Specialist Wagner will slowly tour the lake in his pontoon boat and with binoculars



searching for purple loosestrife, usually about four times per season. You will recognize his pontoon boat by the Purple Loosestrife banner hanging on the side.

If seen, a volunteer will pull each plant by its roots, bag and properly dispose of it and the Water Quality Committee will be notified of the plant's location.

We are fortunate that it has been isolated to two sites thanks to Bruce's diligence. Many surrounding lakes have an abundance of Looseleaf and are losing the battle. Your Water Quality Committee is committed to its eradication. That's why your donation to the Water Quality Fund is essential. To all who have contributed, thank you. For those who haven't, don't wait until its dense growth along the shoreland makes it impossible to access the open water.

promised to follow up on the Camp Kiloqua article a few Barkers back so here goes. Not a whole lot of information was documented on Kiloqua 's demise and the future camp owners history, but suffice it to say, many Birch Lakers were worried about what those many acres on our north east side of the lake would become.

In 19 69–70 rumors were flying that the old

Camp Kiloqua grounds were going to be purchased and converted to a park for RVs and campers. With that thought in mind, many foresaw multiple people, piers, and boats descending upon Birch Lake shores. Some concerned homeowners pooled their resources and purchased the camp with the intention of putting the rumors to rest and opening another sort of camp on the North Shore.

And the Birch Lake Basketball Camp was born.

The camp held five weekly sessions for boys grade 5 through high school. It was directed by Dowagiac basketball coach Claire Willhelm with the assistance of South Bend Adams coach Tom Turnock. Guest area coaches included Dave Hadaway, South Bend Adams, Bob Donewald, South Bend Saint Joe and coaches Miller from Penn Powers from Elkhart, Snyder Plymouth, and Schaefer

The camp lasted for at least four years 1970 to 74 before it's closed its doors. The "horror" of the RV park was averted, and the lots were sold off to the fine homeowners we have now on our North East shore.

Thank you, Birch Lake families who had the foresight to make this happen.




This marked the fourth year of operation for the cage camp. Five weekly sessions were held for boys from the fifth grade through high school. The majority of the youngsters were from the immediate area



# — Camp Tannadoonah —

hank you to everyone who came out Friday night for the candle-light serenade. I'm sorry we got started so late! We had 11 campers who earned the Order of the Birch Award this week, and that ceremony lasted longer than expected, delaying the start of the serenade.

The Order of the Birch is the highest award that a camper can earn at Camp T. Campers who would like to work towards their Order of the Birch have to have been attending camp for at least five summers and must be going into the seventh grade or higher. During the week they are at camp, they must be a model camper, keep their bunk neat and clean, go to each "free choice" activity at least once, attend Polar Bear swim every morning, serve as their cabin's representative on the Camper Council, help the counselors lead our song circle one evening, do a service project to help camp, and at the end of the week at our closing campfire, they must share a poem, a song, or a speech about what Camp means to them.

With 11 campers sharing their poem, song, or speech, the closing campfire went longer than usual on Friday night! I always love hearing the campers share their thoughts about camp, usually telling stories about counselors who had a positive impact on them, or the friendships they've made at camp that last long after they go home, or their favorite

camp songs or activities. Sometimes they get very emotional sharing about the ways that camp has helped them to grow in their life, and the importance of the week they get to spend here each summer.

After each of the campers shared their poem, song, or speech, we concluded the closing campfire with our Order of the Birch Honor Guard. Each staff

member who has been at camp for five or more summers holds a torch, and the honorees are called up to the stage to receive their award. They walk through the honor guard of torches to get to the front and receive their certificate. It's a really special event and a beautiful way to conclude our summer. After that, the Order of the Birch honorees lead us all to the waterfront for the candlelight serenade.

We wrapped up our last session of camp on Saturday morning. The campers checked out around 11am and then our staff got to work packing, cleaning, and closing up things at camp. The counselors have been living at camp for the past 10 weeks, so they had a lot of their own items to pack as they got ready to leave. Plus 10 of them were international



staff, so they had to pack efficiently and decide what they were taking home with them!

We cleaned up all the cabins, put away all the program supplies, and then had a staff banquet to celebrate the end of the season. It's become a tradition the past few years to get Hacienda for the staff banquet, and then watch a video slideshow that our photographer puts together with photos of the staff over the course of the summer. On Sunday morning the staff wraps up a few last tasks and then everyone heads home. The end of the season is always a little bittersweet - we're all exhausted and happy to be done, but also sad to be leaving another summer behind. There are may tearful goodbyes, and promises to "see you next summer!"
