Flood plan open house scheduled

Local, state and federal officials are working to reduce the effects of severe weather and natural disasters. On Tuesday, Sept. 10, FEMA will hold an in-person open house in Cassopolis. At this event, FEMA will answer the questions of residents in Cass County about flood risk and flood insurance after the release of the preliminary flood maps.

FEMA, the state of Michigan, Cass County and Van Buren County community officials invite residents to join them at the Open House. Residents can also see preliminary versions of the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report and the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) here.

The Open House will not have a formal presentation. Residents can attend at any time between 5 to 7 p.m. Experts at the open house will teach residents about flood risk and flood insurance. They can also explain floodplain development regulations and the mapping pro-


cess. Residents can meet with experts one-on-one to look at their own addresses on the new maps. They will learn about their specific risk. They will also learn ways to help prevent flood loss.


The updated maps for Cass County will highlight several streams and flooding sources. These updates encompass 25 Flood Insurance Rate Map panels and cover 21 communities, including 15 townships, four villages and two cities.


Once in effect, the maps will inform flood insurance rates and local floodplain management rules adopted under the National Flood Insurance Program. FEMA urges public officials to use the maps to help plan and prepare communities to quickly respond to and recover from future events.

Property owners, Realtors, lenders and insurance agents will benefit from this chance to learn more about flood risk and hazard mitigation in Cass County.

when my then next-door neighbor Bob King conned me into taking over the job that it would stretch this long; but then I never imagined I would come to love doing it so much either.



Water Quality Committee finances

ast week's Barker discussed in depth the yacht club's finances. One component of those revelations was that it appears to currently have over \$40,000 in its (previously combined) water quality accounts. Certainly, this seems like a substantial amount of money, and in many ways it is.

This account is the positive result of many good people repeatedly doing many good things over a very long period of time. Worthy of our gratitude for this relatively good fortune are:

- 1) Community members who have donated to the Water Quality funds each year in the past and in the present
- 2) Activity leaders and volunteers who have earmarked the fruits of their endeavors for the Water Quality fund
- 3) Water Quality committee members both past and resent who have:
- a) Educated themselves and the community
 - b) Monitored and sampled the lake
- c) Selected and engaged outside consultants to survey and treat our waters
- d) Protected and treated those funds as if they were their own

Current Water Quality Committee members are: Terry Dugan, Rick Russwurm, Jennifer Ball, Cindy Bernaciak, Bruce Wagner, Ron Niezgodski, Patrick Welch, Zack Nickell and Paul Fallon.

On your behalf, they have done, and


are doing, an outstanding job.

It's certainly better to have \$40,000 than to not have \$40,000. But is it enough, or even too much? No one knows for sure, but we (WQC) don't think so.

Please consider:

- 1) Since early in the pandemic, our expenses have increased regularly.
- 2) Annual expenses now are at \$10,000.
- 3) Experts have told us that our next most-likely invasive, starry stonewart, (already in the millpond), will cost an additional \$5,000-20,000 per year to treat.
- 4) We remain susceptible to attack by scores of other invasives
- 5) Hydrilla, one of the most feared invasives, has recently been discovered in two Berrien County bodies of water.
- 6) To minimize the damage, and resultant expense, we must be able to fully and immediately respond when these new invasives arise.
- 7) Over the last few years, we have witnessed a degradation of our water clarity. This has already caused us to order (and pay for) two more sets of more specialized tests and studies.

There are possible, very expensive measures we could someday take to actually help prevent the spread of invasives into Birch. Without prevention, the issues will always be when, not if, the



invasives arise. Our committee is about to commence some long-term planning and goal setting in order to help determine how much of a war chest we think we need and how soon it's needed. As we gain consensus and clarity on these issues, we will share our thoughts with you.

In the meantime, we don't think any of us should rest. We don't know what is coming next, or when it will come. We only know that it is coming. We continue to be amazed (and disappointed) that some 46 percent (almost half) of the lake community members don't bother to contribute anything to Water Quality each year. We think everybody should, and can afford to, give something every year. We should all be in the habit of doing so, together.

promised everyone.







Raspberry Trifle

Prep Time: 20 mins Additional Time: 4 hrs Total Time: 4 hrs 20 mins

Servings: 18 Yield: 1 trifle

Ingredients

1 ½ cups heavy cream ¼ cup white sugar

2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened

2 teaspoons lemon juice

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1/2 cup white sugar

1 (10.75 ounce) package prepared pound cake

2 (10 ounce) packages frozen raspberries, thawed

2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder, for dusting

Directions

In a medium bowl, beat cream with 1/4 cup sugar until stiff peaks form. In another bowl, cream together cream cheese, lemon juice, vanilla and 1/2 cup sugar. Fold 2 cups of whipped cream into cream cheese mixture. Reserve remaining whipped cream.

Slice pound cake into 18 - 1/2 inch slices. Drain raspberries, reserving juice. Line the bottom of a 3 quart glass bowl or trifle bowl with one-third of the cake slices. Drizzle with some raspberry juice. Spread one-fourth of the cream cheese mixture over cake. Sift one-fourth of the cocoa over that. Sprinkle with one-third of the raspberries. Repeat layers twice. Top with remaining cream cheese mixture, whipped cream and sifted cocoa. Cover and refrigerate 4 hours before serving.
