Tuesday, July 4th, is the Annual Boat Parade. It begins at 4:00 In. Please join in or grab a chair and watch the show.



Cass County deputies receive Alco-Sensor for lake patrols

Truth Correspondent VANDALIA — Cass County boaters beware!

The marine division of the Cass County Sheriff's Department is now armed with its own breathalcohol device that will allow them to make arrests based on the results of tests given to boat operators suspected of being drunk.

The Donnell Lake Welfare and Improvement Association, on Saturday, presented the department with its very own Alco-Sensor III.

The Alco-Sensor, along with the 100 mouthpieces they also received, will hopefully keep drunk boat operators from causing serious injury to themselves and others on Cass County lakes this summer.

Richard Shamory, president of the association, said "this is our (the Donnell Lake Association) way of saying thank you to the department for its assistance in keeping our lake safe."

The small piece of equipment cost the association about \$500 and will allow deputies to make arrests on a preliminary charge of operating a boat while under the influence or impaired operation of a boat, depending on the reading, Deputy Ron Carlisle said.

A blood-alcohol level will then be taken at the county jail. Carlisle said anyone refusing

Carlisle said anyone refusing to take the test can automatically be arrested and taken to jail.

Shamory, owner of R.G. Shamory Enterprises Inc. in Mishawaka, admitted most of the problems on his lake come from transients or outsiders. "We police ourselves," he said of the lake residents.

The association gave the device to the department with the stipulation it be used only for marine work during the boating season. During the rest of the year, the department can use it for other work, he said, "hopefully for snowmobile patrol."

Shamory said the lake association recently completed the firstever in the state of Michigan boater safety course for adults.

He said they had more than 30 adults from as far away as Lake Michigan and St. Joseph River residents take the course offered at the Penn Township hall. He said that before offering the course he contacted a dozen insurance companies asking them if they would be willing to offer an insurance discount for adults who completed the class.

They all said yes, some up to 10 percent on each boat except jet-ski watercraft type equipment.

The sheriff's department also had its new personnel take the course, Shamory said.

In Michigan, a child between the ages of 12 and 16 must successfully complete a boater safety course before operating a boat of over 5 horsepower. But there is no such requirement for an adult.

Ninety-one adults and youngsters showed up for the course the association offered. It will be offered once a year. Shamory said, at the beginning of the season. Upon successful completion of the class a certificate is issued.

"I just want to be out there and be safe." he said of the equipment donated and the class the association sponsored.

The manufacturer of the Alco-Sensor 111 also makes similar equipment for the federal government and the military.

The suspect breathes into the mouthpiece and a reading is automatically shown on the front. From that reading, the deputy makes his/her determination regarding an arrest.

"Hopefully the 100 extra mouthpieces will take us through the summer," Shamory said.

As a resident, please inform guests and renters of this rule. Also inform guests and renters of the Michigan laws governing boating.




