#### **WATER QUALITY REPORT: EURASIAN MILFOIL**

Turasian watermilfoil has been a problematic invasive weed Jin Michigan lakes for decades.

■ The state of the stat Eurasian Milfoil is an aggressive, tallgrowing, exotic aquatic plant from Europe and Asia. Once introduced, it can grow to the surface in up to 10 to 15 feet of water. At the surface, it forms a dense canopy of vegetation, reducing in abundance many native plants. In dense conditions, it is a serious localized and lake-wide problem. It is not a significant food crop for waterfowl, other birds, or aquatic mammals. It also conflicts with many recreational activities. It readily regenerates from detached fragments and spreads rapidly. Consequently, this

# THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues.



plant can form dense colonies covering much of a lake's shoreline out to a depth of about 20 feet.

On Friday, May 29th, Progressive AE surveyed Birch Lake for invasive species of aquatic vegetation. Progressive AE surveys the entire lake every year and has been doing so since 2007. This year, two sites were identified as having invasive species. One of the sites is at the north end of the east shore, where Eurasian Milfoil and Curley Leaf Pond Weed were identified. Curly Leaf Pond Weed is not a concern because when the water temperature rises into the 70's it will die.

On the other hand, the Milfoil will need to be treated. The other site is in the cove, where it was also identified last year. We were unable to treat last year due to not acquiring a timely permit, but we are good to go this year. Professional Lake Management is scheduled to treat the two sites and treatment should be completed by the time you read this. Last year we treated 1 acre. This year we will treat a total of 1½ acres. There is also an area on the north side that we are monitoring.


After the treatment has had time to take effect, Progressive AE will return for a second survey to inspect the sites. Again, at that time they will survey the entire lake for any invasive species. Depending on their findings, we may need a second treatment.


This annual program is important to keep Eurasian Milfoil under control and to detect any other invasive species in the early stages to enable us to better control them. With your continued support we can maintain this important program and avoid having to deal with acres of invasive species like many other lakes are currently experiencing.

# BIRCH LAKE SAILING

The wind didn't cooperate last weekend, so no new sailing results and standings to report. Instead we have some "sailing stuff" submitted by Bob King (north shore). Thanks, Bob!

Then I was a kid, my Dad (Bill King ~ RIP) was a homespun entrepreneur (before the term existed). He was plenty busy running the family manufacturing business, but had a couple "side-hustles" too, including marine supply? I'm quite certain that side job was just to obtain manufacturer discounts for his partner (who lived on Diamond Lake), and everyone here at Birch.

Eventually, they represented (were granted territory by manufacturers) SmokerCraft boats, Evinrude engines (and boats), Cypress Garden skis and ... about everything else in the West Marine Catalog. My favorite holding was when they became a Sunfish dealer. AMF AlCort (a combination of the founders' names, Alex Bryan and Cortlandt Heyniger) began producing daysailor dinghies in 1945. By 1960 they switched from a plywood kit boat to the modern plastic version in fiberglass.

Over time, we sold hundreds of boats into the surrounding lakes and shazam, fleets were born! In 2000, we drove around the lake by car and counted hulls then ... added that tally to those viewed from the water. There

were 60(!) boats on Birch. Strangely, half are moved to launch position but don't come out on Sundays? Why? Please join our fleet! Is your boat in need of help? We can fix anything. Need a sail? Those are available too. Contact Fleet Cap'n Bob (rjniezgodski@gmail.com) and we will get you out there!

A tangent: there is a boat for sale (see classified) by Tammy Hanstine. This was Tom Howard's race boat. Tom was a seriously accomplished sailor and that boat is worth buying. #### **BIRCH LAKE HISTORY: CAMP T PROPERTY**

Editor's Note: This season in the Barker, we plan to feature different properties on the lake each week, with historical information about the families who have lived there, photos, and stories. e're taking a look at the history of the Camp T property on the north shore this week. The South Bend Camp Fire girls acquired the first piece of property in 1930, but there were a number of families who preceded Camp on the hill overlooking Birch Lake.


According to an 1897 Porter Township Plat map, the entire cove was owned by John J. Doane, and the entire north shore by E. C. Doane at that time. In the early 1900s, the cove area was referred to as "Doane's Cove," and many families camped there each summer.

In 1903, John Doane sold a parcel of his property to Wm. T. Jefferson of Chicago, for the price of \$200. Only three years after building his home at Birch Lake, Mr. Jefferson was offering it for sale because he had "to go east." The home was purchased by Dr. Ersom Mills Cunningham and his wife, Katherine Josephine Cunningham. On the 1914

the plat map, property is listed Doane in the name of K. J. Cunningham. The land comprised the entire shoreline that now belongs to camp, and appears impto have extended to son about the northern-most point of the cove.



Dr. Cunningham was a medical doctor who served the Cassopolis and Vandalia area. The Cunninghams had seven children: six daughters and one son. They called their home at Birch Lake "KathMarDo Lodge," for their oldest three children: Katherine, Margaret, and Dorothy. Their home is what is now known as "Main Lodge" at camp.

Several of the children were born in the house at Birch Lake, including their daughter Mary Cunningham Deitle, who was born in August of 1912. Mary visited camp with her daughter Ann in 2010 when we were celebrating the 100th anniversary of Camp Fire. She told us stories of her childhood at KathMarDo Lodge. Her daughter Ann Deitle worked at Camp T in the 1960s!

In 1919, Katherine Cunningham sold the land at Birch Lake to an attorney from Niles, Wilber N. Burns. The Burns family, along with the Schmidts, Smiths, and Thayers occupied most of the north shore at this time. In the early 1920s, it appears that the Boy Scouts utilized the Burns property for a number of camping trips, and at one point were considering purchasing the property from the Burns family.

BOY SCOUTS T Niles Boy Scouts will start Tuesday

morning on a three day camping party at the cottage of Atty. W. N. Burns at Birch lake. Henry Harwood, on the southwest side of Pleasant Lake. The Camp Fire girls adopted the name "Camp Tannadoonah" in 1923.

In 1929, the South Bend Camp Fire council formed a committee to locate a property to become the permanent home for their summer camp. The committee was chaired by Mr. Charles W. Copp, a Camp Fire board member and owner Copp's Music Store in South Bend. After Camp Fire purchased the property from W. N. Burns in 1930, they moved a building from the Edwardsburg site to the edge of Birch Lake, in the cove. This building was then named "Copp Lodge," in honor of Mr. Copp.

#### WILL CONSIDER CAMP SITES.

Further discussion of prospective camp sites will be the chief interest of the board of directors of the Camp Fire Girls' organization at a meeting in Camp Fire headuarters this evening at 7:30 o'clock. Choice of the new camp now centers on a tract at Birch lake, Michigan. C. W. Copp is chairman of the camp committee.

January 7, 1930, South Bend Tribune

There were two buildings present on the site when Camp Fire acquired it, and both are still used today! The original house which we call Main Lodge is used for staff housing, and the building the Burns called their "guest cottage" is now our camp store and crafts building. Camp Fire had an old school house moved to the site and attached it to the west side of the lodge. This was used as the Dining Hall in the earliest days. They constructed six small cabins on the bluff, and four of those buildings were still in use until just last year.



Camp Fire girls setting the tables for a meal in 1940. This room is on the west end of Main Lodge, and in still in use today as the Staff Lounge for our summer camp staff.

Over the next few decades, Camp Fire aquired additional parcels of land from Clifford Lyon (1932; the parcel that borders Harvey St.), from Lowell and Alice Lyon (1940; the parcel that runs along the top of the bluff above the homes on the north shore), and from Luther and Mildred Binkley (1952; the parcel behind the homes in the cove).

Morris Lodge was built in 1938, and named in honor of Mr. E. M. Morris. The current Dining Hall was built in 1954 using funds from a bequest from Mrs. K.C. DeRhodes. The "Birds" cabins were built with additional funds from that bequest. The Kiwanis Health Center was built in 1960. After that, nearly 30 years passed before the Shower House was constructed in 1989. Camp T has now been serving campers on Birch Lake for more than 95 years!








# SUMMER RECIPES: ALMOND FLOUR BROWNIES

weet, decadent and ultra-fudgy, these almond flour brownies are rich and delicious. Made with only a few simple ingredients, you'll never believe these brownies are naturally grain-free. If you try to eat glutenfree, these are an amazing dessert option that actually taste like regular brownies!

#### **Ingredients:**

5 tablespoons butter, melted 1¾ cups granulated sugar ½ teaspoon table salt 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

34 cup unsweetened cocoa - Dutch-process or natural

1½ cups almond flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 2. Grease an 8" square pan or 9" round pan; either should be at least 2" deep.
- 3. In a medium-sized bowl, stir together the melted butter, sugar, salt, vanilla, cocoa, and eggs.
- 4. Stir in the almond flour and baking powder.
- 5. Scoop the batter into the prepared pan, spreading it to the edges.
- 6. Bake the brownies for 33 to 38 minutes, until the top is set; and a cake tester or toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean or nearly so, with perhaps a few wet crumbs, or a tiny touch of chocolate at the tip of the tester.
- 7. Remove the brownies from the oven and cool them for about 15 minutes before cutting.
- 8. Once the brownies are cool, cover them tightly with plastic. Store at room temperature for several days; freeze for longer storage.

# A MESSAGE FROM THE BIRCH LAKE HOME OWNER'S ASSOCIATION

The Birch Lake Homowners Association (HOA) does not mandate or enforce laws, rules and guidelines on issues like construction, lawns, nuisances, pets, etc. The HOA will NOT show up at your home to tell you to cut your grass, replace your mailbox or park in specific areas. It does NOT issue citations or impose fines, and it does NOT arrange for snow or weed removal, handle common area maintenance, or address neighbor disputes.

To understand what this group does, it is helpful to have a little bit of explanation and background.

The HOA was formed in the mid-1990s to address issues and problems of property owners at Birch Lake, specifically the issues that are not part of the goals and mission of the Birch Lake Yacht Club (BLYC). The HOA is a committee of the BLYC, but it is a committee with a separate and independent membership and board of directors and with its own separate finances which only the HOA can direct. The association often interacts with the BLYC and its various commitees (like the Water Quality Committee and the Safety Committee) on a variety of lake-related items, and HOA funds are occasionally used to fund or supplement BLYC funding when the goals and direction of the groups coincide.




The HOA is self-tasked with the following:

- Monitoring and working with governmental groups and agencies at all levels to keep abreast of current, proposed and/or pending laws, regulations, legislation, codes or issues that affect or may affect Birch Lake property owners ion the future. In the past these have included a wide variety of public groups that oversee areas like the Birch Lake public landing and Lake Park, township-wide zoning, county-wide parks, roads, culverts, waterways (ditches, streams etc.), keyholeing, pier restrictions, property taxes, as well as state-wide issues like, shortterm property rental (AirBnBs, VRBOs, etc.).
- Actively promoting and working to ensure and enhance the health and safety of residents (and guests), and to encourage responsible behaviors in terms of vehicular and boat operations and water safety. The group initiated the

- acquisition, installation and ongoing maintenance of six Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) at key locations around the lake and arranges regular training in their use. The HOA arranges cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training for residents, should an emergency medical situation arise.
- Actively promote the sense and value of our safety, neighborliness and community through the use of public service messages in the Birch Barker and the Birch Lake Directory. Past messages have addressed issues including water safety, invasive species, pets, loud music, exterior lighting, power loading at the landing, and volunteerism.


Board members are elected for three-year terms by the members of the association who have voluntarily joined by paying a \$10/year fee. The board meets with members annually to provide updates, special programs and speakers and hold elections for board membership. The HOA board also meets occasionally during the summer, and special board meetings are called whenever a problem or issue is identified.

The Birch Lake HOA is currently directed by an elected board that consists of Chairperson Blair Garceau (east), Scott Troeger (east), Rick Russwurm (north), Paul Fallon (east), and Phil Vitale (east).
