

#### WATER QUALITY REPORT: VOICES FROM THE LAKE

This year, the Water Quality Committee has asked some long-time residents of the lake for their perspective of Birch Lake and the importance of its water quality. The series of articles called, "Voices From The Lake", represent unique viewpoints: some historical, others subjective and even one poetic like our first, from Jan Temple. Thank you to all of our authors for contributing. We hope you enjoy their "Voices". Your Water Quality

Tarly this spring we had a bit of a scare, which turned out to be an ■ algae bloom that covered most of our precious lake. But now, thankfully, the water is clear and blue and beautiful once again.

The lesson, at least for me, is that we can never take our water quality for granted. And each of us needs to do what we can to protect our lake from too much phosphorus — from fertilizer runoff and disruption of the lake bottom from our boat motors — or other contaminants. In addition, our donations to the Water Quality Program (through the Yacht Club) fund the important testing and treatments needed to help keep the water safe for swimming and fishing.

Many of us have been blessed with generations of memories at Birch Lake. And we have a lot of new families that have a chance to do the same. We all want our children and grandchildren to be able to enjoy our lake — not just today, but every day for many years to come.

I found this poem below as published in an August 1999 edition of the Birch Barker. It was written by Gertie Temple (my mom) as an "expression" from our dear Birch Lake — and pretty much sums up our shared love and promise to "the jewel of Cass County".





t was spring, 1943. My mother had seen an ad in the So. Bend Tribune about a L cottage for sale at Birch Lake. It sounded great, so we got in the car, along with Aunt Helen and Uncle Ham, and drove up to the lake. It was very muddy, and the roads were all gravel and very rough. The hill by our cottage was not like it is today... Back then, it was very steep and bumpy. We drove down and got stuck in the parking area, but loved the cottage.

We couldn't get in, but looked in the windows. When we got back to town, my mother called Mrs. Wygant and said we would buy it. She already had a buyer, but they did not have cash. We did! So we got it.

The cottage was completely furnished. It had wicker furniture and beautiful oval rag rugs. The outside was white with red window boxes. There were about 17 trees on our lot. That made it very dark inside, so my father had a lot of his friends come up one day and start cutting down trees. We still had lots of trees left, and over the years they got bigger and bigger. Inside the cottage we had a pump in the kitchen, and many oil lamps as the electricity went out all the time.

Denny was 7 years old when her parents, Frank and Rose Horvath, bought their cottage at Birch Lake. Every summer the family would move up to the lake. She recalls walking around the lake with other kids, playing cards, and swimming every day, even if it was cold. Every morning, her friend Gib Eberhart would pick her up in his fishing boat and they would ride around the lake, with Denny sitting on the bow of the boat "like a movie star." The neighbors had a raft with a high dive, and Denny says it "was a big deal when you finally got the courage to dive from the top."

Denny and other youth from the lake were the original founders of the Birch Barker. One rainy day in the summer of 1944, four kids were at Jane Cox's house complaining that they had nothing to do. Her father suggested they write a Birch Lake newspaper, and proposed the name "Birch Barker."

The kids went door to door collecting news from the lake, and then wrote the stories. Mr. Cox took their stories and had his secretary type them up and make copies at his office. The kids walked around the lake selling copies for \$0.10. And thus, the Birch Barker was born. They published 3 editions that first summer. The first editor was Chuck Schott, Denny was the Secretary and Treasurer, and Marsha Enyeart, Jane Cox, and Gib Eberhart were the reporters. Over the next decade the family got a bigger boat and a sailboat. They also purchased the lot next door, which had previously been a county park known as "Forest Park." Denny remembers having friends coming to the lake all the time. The teens would go sailing, play in the lake on a surf board, and have hayrides, bonfires, and parties. She says she spent most of her days on the raft with "a pile of comic books, a coke, and a bottle of baby oil with iodine in it (for tanning)."

The youth from around the lake would walk to Williamsville to buy penny candy and ice cream at Lanky's (Breece's) General Store. Denny recalls Birch Lakeshore Drive (south side) ending at a fence just beyond Earl Troeger's house. There was a cow pasture and the kids would climb the fence and run through the field to keep away from the cows.

Lanky also had the only telephone in the area. Once telephone service did come to the lake, the entire lake shared four party lines! Lanky's delivered ice to the residents of the lake, and would let the kids ride on the truck on top of the ice. He would chip off some ice and they would suck on the ice while riding around the lake. There was a second general store called "Tubby's" in Williamsville as well.

When she was around 15, Denny started dating Keith Weesner, whom she would later marry. Denny was a cheerleader and Keith was a football player. During the summers, they would come to swim at the lake in between two-a-day football practices. One of the friends who joined them at the lake in those days was Jim Bradfield, who was a good friend of Keith's in high school. Coincidentally, Keith's aunt and uncle, Bernie and Helen Weesner, also had a cottage at Birch Lake.

Frank's brother, Steve Horvath, was a frequent visitor to their cottage at the lake. He would come to the lake every Wednesday with a group of kids from the Y, and taught everyone to swim and to ski. In 1972 Steve and his wife Irene bought the cottage next door from Betty Bowers. Their grandson, Mark VanHuffel, is now the owner of that home.

The original Pair-A-Dice cottage was home to the Horvath-Weesner family every summer for nearly 55 years. In 1996 the original cottage was torn down and the current house was built. Today, Denny and her husband Jim Bradfield, and her daughter Ronni Eshleman and her husband Gus live at Birch Lake. Steve and Rose's great-great-grandchildren are 5th generation Birch Lakers and love to spend time at the lake.










#### **SUMMER RECIPES: CHICKPEA SALAD**

ooking for a salad with a light and refreshing taste that's still big on flavor? Enter: Chickpea Salad with Smashed Cucumbers. This veggie-packed dish is loaded with crunchy textures and mouth-watering flavors, making it a perfect healthy side dish or easy summer salad you can enjoy all year long.

- 1. With side of chef's knife, bash cucumbers slightly to crush, halve lengthwise, then cut each into 4 to 6 chunks. Transfer cucumbers to bowl and toss with 2 teaspoons of salt. Let sit 10 minutes.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, whisk together lemon juice and honey to dissolve. Whisk in oil, capers, oregano, and ¼ teaspoon each of salt and pepper. Add onion, jalapeño, and chickpeas and toss to combine. Let sit at least 10 minutes.
- Transfer cucumbers to colander and rinse, then shake off as much water as possible. Add to bowl with dressing, along with tomatoes and parsley, and toss to combine. Serve topped with feta if desired.







#### IN AN EMERGENCY






#### **Arithmagons**


