



#### WATER QUALITY REPORT: WATER TESTING

# What does your Birch Lake Water Quality Committee do for you and Birch Lake?

erry Dugan introduced John and I as the water testers for Birch Lake in the May 31 issue of the Barker. Terry was the devoted water tester for many years. We wanted to take on the task because Birch Lake is a big part of our life stories. John has been on Birch Lake his entire life - 73 years. I have been a part of the Birch Lake community since 1978.

I would like to share with you how we get the data regarding our lake. It is not a

"one and done" testing process that yields a magic number. Our data is years in the making, collected by someone on the Water Quality Committee.

Our lake belongs to the Michigan Lakes and Streams Association, a state-wide organization that dedicates itself to the preservation and protection of Michigan inland lakes. You can check them out at: *mymlsa.org*. MLSA also publishes the *Michigan Riparian* magazine dedicated to the lifestyle and interests of all Michigan lake residents. You can join MLSA on your own and receive four issues of the magazine, and you can sign up for news and information through their email newsletter. MLSA membership is open to anyone.

MLSA partners with Michigan Clean Water Corps (MiCorps) which is led by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE). EGLE serves as program administrator of our volunteer lake water quality monitoring program. The Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program (CLMP) is the second oldest citizen volunteer lake water monitoring program. CLMP makes it possible for lake associations to measure the physical, biological and chemical parameters of inland lakes.

All volunteers are trained and equipped to monitor the following for Birch Lake:

- Secchi Disk-Water Transparency: weekly or biweekly, mid-May to mid-September.
- 2. Spring and Summer Total Phosphorus: Spring is collected within 2 weeks after the ice isoff the lake. Summer is collected late summer.
- 3. Chlorophyll a: a measure of how much algae is present in the lakes water column. The testing is in May, June, July, August, and September.
- 4. Dissolved Oxygen and Temperature: up to 85 feet. DO and Temp are tested and recorded every other week May through September.

Testing the water of Birch Lake is a 5-6-month commitment each year.

The collected samples of Total Phosphorus and Chlorophyll a are frozen and turned into the EGLE office near Kalamazoo twice a year on our designated date. Secchi Disk, Dissolved Oxygen and Temperature recordings are maintained May through September and then reported

either by mail or email to MLSA on or before October 31st.

Each year the previous year's Birch Lake summary report of the data collected from CLMP is sent to the water testing

# THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues.



the following: Exotic Aquatic Plant Watch, Aquatic Plant Mapping, Score the Shore and Lakeshore Habitat Assessment. Plus, we work with outside contractors for the right treatment of invasive plant species.

Your Water Quality Committee not only raises money to fund the education, tests and analysis described in this article; we also have the lake surveyed, permitted and treated for invasives, all by professionals. Also, it's important to note

that your donation to Water Quality is for just that - no other BLYC events or needs are paid with Water Quality funds.



DNF (Did Not Finish) or DSQ (Disqualified) scores as last place (if 5 boats started the race, you will be scored as 5th place).

DNF, DSQ are not counted toward minimum number of races needed

 $\mbox{CB}$  - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total.

Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted

were introduced to Birch Lake when I spent a week at Camp Tannadoonah as a Camp Fire girl. They fell in love with the beauty of the lake, its setting, and proximity to South Bend. In 1956 they purchased property on the South side of the lake on the "shallow cove" four lots from the dam. Dad and my brother Dave built what would eventually become Dad and Mom's retirement home

In the winters on the weekends Dave, myself, and some of the other kids from the shallow cove would ice skate on the lake. The water in the cove was only mid-thigh deep so it quickly froze over and dad would make sure the ice was thick enough. We would clear off an area and skate until we were so cold we couldn't skate anymore, then we would go in and sit around the fireplace and drink hot cocoa. It was eerie to hear the ice crack and echo across the lake

In the early years Dave would race around the lake in a small speed boat he and dad built. Eventually they built a bigger boat for water skiing and we spent summers enjoying that sport.

Julie Ebling Weaver took me sailing and the bug bit me. The lake had a fleet of Snipe sailboats and I wanted one. With the help of Earl Troeger, a lake sailing enthusiast, I learned to sail. Dave and I sailed on the weekends in races on Birch. Eagle, and Diamond Lakes. There's no feeling like being in a sailboat on a run with the sound of the water against the bow and wind in the sails. Heaven! Then you have to come about, pull in the whisker pole, trim the jib, dodge the boom, and scramble to the high side of the boat to hang over the side to keep the dagger board in the water! The only rush bigger is behind a ski boat digging your ski in to fly across the wake, turn and fly back across to the other side.

Dad and Mom took a more sedate route and added a pontoon boat to their growing fleet for relaxing cruises around the lake in the evening, One summer we kids in the cove decorated it and used it in the float parade.

Not all summer activities involved water sports. On rainy days a bunch of us would gather at someone's house and play cards and board games and have popcorn and Kool-Aid. On good days we might walk up to Lanky's General Store for penny candy or minor necessities. There were no commercial entities on the lake per se, although for a time Winarski's sold pop and ice cream treats from their basement. Lankey's was the closest place for gas also. In the early days we could walk down to the public beach once a week to check out books from the Cass Library bookmobile.

Because we didn't have the ambient lights of the city, nighttime at the lake had its own spectacular views. Being on the south side, one time we got to see the Northern Lights over Camp Tannadoonah. In August, we could watch the Persied Meteor Shower. Talk about wishing on a falling star! Fireworks displays were awesome too.

If dad beeped his horn coming down the hill on Walnut Rd coming into Williamsville, where you could see the mill pond, we could hear it at the cottage. One summer we heard music coming from up the hill so Dave and I drove up to see where it was coming from. It turned out that the Evans brothers and Paul Dennert, another Birch Laker were having a jam session at their auto repair garage on Brownsville Rd. Paul was a member of *The Rivieras*. Lots of lake kids were there, and it is one of the many great memories I have of Birch Lake

When we first started spending summers at the lake, there was a year-end potluck and square dance at the Grange Hall in Jones. Eventually with the donation of land, materials, and fund raising by a lot of the lake residents, the Birch Lake Yacht Club was built. At first it was just a one-story cinder block building in the side of the hill with a dirt road. Dances were held on the weekend to the tunes of a jukebox which Bill King - as Senior Commodore - and I - as Junior Commodore - managed to scrounge up

from somewhere. The year-end potluck was now held on the lake, too.

David's daughter Lisa and my daughter Shannon also spent summers at the lake. Cards and board games were still a part of rainy days but water skiing was now behind John Ehrhardt's boat. The book mobile didn't come anymore and Lanky's was closed. Walks up the hill were now to Tom's, next door to Lanky's, for penny candy. He was also the new site for gas. Three generations built lifetime friendships and enjoyed the beauty of Birch Lake.

Eventually my stepdaughter Sherry, and her husband Bill Holleman stayed with my Mom and Dad while they built their home in the cove next to Tannadoonah, but that's a story for another day.

So in the words of Bob Hope,"thanks for the memories" Birch Lake.







#### IN AN EMERGENCY






