- No matter your speed, power boats must travel COUNTER CLOCKWISE
- Go slow near other boats, rafts, and the shore. You are responsible for your wake.
- Stay 100ft from shore, other boats, and rafts when you are traveling over wake speed.
- When pulling a skiier, wakeboarder, wakesurfer, or tuber, you MUST have an observer at all times.
- There must be US Coast Guard approved life vests for every person on board, as well as one throwable device (e.g., seat cushion).
- All children 5 and younger MUST be in a USCG Type 2 life jacket (PFD) when aboard any boat. Many common life vests are NOT Type 2 PFDs. Check the label!
- All boats must have a horn, fire extingisher, and valid registration on board.
- Jet skis have many special rules. It is your responsibility to know and obey the laws!

2025 BOAT PARADE GRAND MARSHALS

his year's Boat Parade Grand Marshals are Scott and Holly Troeger.

Holly and Scott Troeger purchased their cottage on Birch Lake in the fall of 1993 but



Scott and his family have been here much longer. Right after World War II ended, Scott's grandparents Earl and Esther Troeger offered their three teenage boys the choice of either a boat on Lake Michigan or a cottage on an inland lake. After renting what is now the Steffans' house on the east shore, they were sold on Birch Lake and bought a lot on the middle of the south side. Grampa and his three boys built the log cabin that is still there, which is now shared and enjoyed by three of Scott's cousins and their families.

Scott spent all of his early childhood summers at his grandparents' cottage along with his two brothers and seven cousins. In 1964 and 1965, Scott's parents Jack and Janet rented the Haines cottage on the east side. At that cottage was an old wooden Snipe sailboat. Scott's Dad let the Hague boys from the south side race that Snipe if they taught Scott to crew. The Hagues were good sailors and teachers - when Scott was 10 he skippered that Snipe and won his first BLYC sailing trophy.

In 1966, Scott's parents bought the property where Pat and Sue Williams' place is located. Scott and his brothers Tim and Steve spent their summers growing up there surrounded by other lake kids, playing in the water, fishing, waterskiing, and sailing a Sunfish and a Hobie Cat.

In the meantime, Holly was growing up in Winnetka, north of Chicago. Her mother's family is from Massachusetts, so Holly spent several childhood summers in Scituate, on the seacoast just south of Boston. Their paths crossed when Scott graduated from law school and became an associate at the Chicago law firm where Holly worked as a paralegal.

Scott introduced Holly to Birch Lake in the summer of 1982. They drove to the lake from Chicago nearly every summer weekend until they moved to Elkhart in 1985, largely in order to be closer to Birch! In the 40-some years since then, Holly has become a complete lake girl and raised their two daughters, Amy and Victoria (Tory) and their son Neil to love Birch Lake. The kids have grown up and now live in St Louis, Grand Rapids, and Chicago but continue to visit every chance they get.

Holly served as the BLYC Treasurer for 17 years and delivered Birch Barkers for over 25 years. She also helps organize our BLYC Trivia Night. Scott has served on the BLYC board since 1995 and on the BLYC Homeowners' Association board since its creation in 1997. He was

the BLYC Fleet Captain in 1999 and 2000, and the BLYC Commodore in 1997. Scott and Holly were awarded the BLYC Commodore's Award in 1999.

About 5 years ago, Scott retired from the practice of corporate law at Barnes and Thornburg, where he had been an office managing partner and on the firm's management and compensation committee. Once the children were grown and out of school, Scott and Holly made Birch Lake their official full time home.

Central to Scott's childhood memories are his Grampa's gorgeous wooden Century ski boat. She had a dark mahogany hull with a blonde wooden deck and a loud powerful inboard engine. Naturally, Scott couldn't resist when decades later he found a mahogany Century inboard ski boat with a blonde wooden deck that looked almost exactly like Grampa's. If and when that boat (which Holly disrespectfully refers to as the Guppy) decides to cooperate, you may see and hear her zipping around the lake.

WATER QUALITY REPORT: PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE

t first glance, Purple Loosestrife looks like a pretty, flowering Lplant that grows near shores, wetlands and along roadsides. It is, in fact, a very INVASIVE plant species which at one time was for sale at plant nurseries around the country. It is now illegal to sell Purple Loosestrife. It is on the State of Michigan's INVASIVE SPECIES ALERT list. The concern is that given the right conditions, Purple Loosestrife can rapidly establish and replace native vegetation. This can lead to a reduction in plant diversity, which reduces habitat value to wildlife. Without proper removal, this plant can spread seeds and multiply tremendously, eventually taking over shorelines. It has been a huge problem at many of our nearby lakes.



Birch Lake has been extremely fortunate to have a low number of Loosestrife plants. The Water Quality Committee has worked diligently over many years to identify and eradicate plants by monitoring our shorelines and taking immediate action. This year is no different. Tom Kuhn and Cindy Bernaciak will be out combing the shoreline the week of July 14th and subsequently again in August and September. You will see them in a pontoon very close to shore with our B.L.Y.C. WATER QUALITY LOOSESTRIFE CONTROL sign on the side of the boat.

BLY.C. WATER QUALITY LOOSESTRIFE CONTROL

What can you do? Check your property for this plant, especially near the shore or wet areas of your yard. Identification: Height varies from 4 to



10 feet, leaves are arranged in pairs, the square stem is covered in downy hair, flower spikes are MAGENTA in color with 5-7 petals per flower and is present for most of the summer.

If you think you see it, please notify Tom (708-772-7373) or Cindy (773-401-9191). We will come out and identify if it is Loosestrife and we will take the necessary steps to remove any plants. This is done carefully as to not let the seeds spread and take over other areas.

This is just another important way YOUR Water Quality Committee works for you! Please remember we go above and beyond to keep our beautiful Birch Lake for today and the future.

Important Addendum From Your Water Quality Committee:

As a safety precaution prior to the holiday weekend, testing for E coli was conducted without consequence at five different sites around the lake. E coli

is a normal gut bacterium of warm blooded animals and can escape to the environment via fecal contamination, geese, swans. muskrats, dogs, or at worse sewage contamination. High levels can be indication an of potential other fecal pathogens. Current testing indicates absolutely no issue regarding E coli as has been the case since testing was 2008. initiated in Safe swimming.



The here at Camp T hope that you had a relaxing and restful holiday weekend! After a few days off for the staff, we are ready to get back to camp with renewed energy and enthusiasm. The 4th of July break marks just about the midway point for our season, so we are hitting our stride and gearing up for some full sessions towards the end of the summer! This weekend is the start of Session 4, and this week we have over 130 campers joining us for a week of fun!

Our specialty activities that are only offered this week include Volleyball, Zoology, and Advanced Sailing. Volleyball is always a very popular activity, and one that campers really enjoy practicing outside of their activity periods as well. In Zoology, campers will get a chance to learn more about the living things around them and around the world, seeing how they are adapted to their environment and how they interact with each other. Hammock Time at Camp

This summer, we have added a new activity to our line up for every week! This activity is called Chill Zone, and it gives campers the opportunity to take some quiet time during the day. larke and Eunice purchased their cottage in Sylvan Shores on the south side in May of 1941 from Charles J. Parker. Mr. Zesinger worked at Studebaker with Mr. Parker, who was building at cottage at Birch Lake as a surprise for his wife. After seeing how "rough and remote" the location was, she refused the idea. They sold their nearly-completed cottage to the Zesingers, and bought a place at Diamond Lake (from the September 4, 2004 Birch Barker biography of Bud Zesinger). Clarke was also good friends with Frank Foote, who owned the cottage next door (#47, now belonging to Claude Petit). The original Zesigner cottage (#46) is now owned by Becky Wiseman.



June-Bud Pointe

The Zesinger cottage was known as June-Bud Pointe, for their two children who were 11 and 2 years old when they first came to Birch Lake. Bud recalls that they would "take our shoes off when we got to the lake and not put them on until we went home at the end of the summer." They spent every summer at

the lake, swimming and playing with dozens of other lake kids, many of whose families are still here at Birch Lake Bud remembers the moms and kids taking nearly daily walks around the lake, and stopping at Lazy Lodge for ice cream.

In 1944, when a group of young people from the lake published the first three editions of the Birch Barker, Bud (then age 5) is listed as a reporter, and his sister June (who now goes by Carol) as one of the editors.

Frank Foote and Clarke Zesinger designed and constructed the weir dam at the south side of the lake to prevent fish from leaving the lake. Frank built the cast iron grate in his machine shop, and he and Clarke worked together to install it. Both men were avid fishermen and dedicated to conservation, and wanted to protect the fish population in the lake. In those days, the shallow area in the southwest corner of the lake was undeveloped and marshy, and Bud remembers taking his flat-bottomed fishing boat into the marsh and seeing huge leatherback turtles, fish, and other wildlife.

The Zesingers sold their south side cottage in 1954, when Bud was in high school at Riley. He went on to play varsity golf at Notre Dame, and married Barbara Kirkendall in 1960. They often vacationed at Birch, renting the Scannell cottage (south side #74) and what Bud refers to as "Lanky's cottage" (east side #133, now owned by Norman Monroe). (editor's note: I did not know until interviewing Bud for this story that Gerald Breece, aka Lanky, originally owned that cottage!)

In 1973, while renting at the lake for a week, Bud spotted a cottage on the north shore that appeared to be unoccupied. He says he waited until winter, and then called the owner, Myron Weldy,

and asked if he was interested in selling. He said yes, and just a few days later they met at the bank to complete the

week to start working on some repairs to the cottage, and Mr. and Mrs. Weldy pulled up to the cottage. She wanted to buy it back! He declined their offer, and this became the Zesinger cottage for the next decade (#268, where Kolber's is now).

Bud and Barb had three children, Buddy, Cindy, and Brad, who were 12, 10, and 5 when they purchased the cottage. They spent most of their summers at the lake, much like Bud had as a child. After a decade on the north shore, Bud and Barb were looking for a bigger place, and the Chuck Fortino, who lived on the east side (#170) mentioned to Bud that they were looking to move as well. In 1985, the two families swapped properties, the Zesingers moving to the east side and the Fortinos moving to the north.

In 1988, Bud and Barb completely remodeled the house and moved to the lake full time. Over the past five decades, their three children and six grandchildren have made many special memories at the lake, and there are now two great-grandchildren who will be the 5th generation of Zesingers at Birch Lake!







SUMMER RECIPES: 4TH OF JULY SWIRL PIE

The perfect dessert to wow your guests this Independence Day? Best of all, it's NO BAKE! Featuring vibrant red, white, and blue swirls in a smooth, creamy filling.

Crust: In a medium bowl, combine graham cracker crumbs, sugar, and melted butter. Stir until the mixture resembles wet

sand. Press into the bottom and up the sides of a 9-inch pie dish or tart pan. Chill in the refrigerator while preparing the filling.

Prepare the swirls: In a small saucepan add the red berries and

sugar. Simmer over medium heat until berries soften and release

juice (abotu 5-7 minutes). Use a blender or immersion blender to puree. Press through a fine mesh sieve for a smoother swirl.

Make the cream filling: In a large bowl, beat cream cheese until

smooth and fluffy. Add powdered sugar and vanilla, beat until

incorprated. In a separate chilled bowl, whip cold heavy cream

to stiff peaks. Gently fold the whipped cream into the cream

cheese mixture in 2-3 batches until smooth and airy. Spoon the filling into the chilled crust and spread evenly. Dot spoonfulls of the red and blue sauces on top. Use a skewer or knife to gently

swirl the colors into the filling. Don't overmix! You want distinct

streaks. Refrigerate for at least 6 hours before serving.

Let cool completely. Repeat the process with the blueberries.

1¼ cups graham cracker crumbs (about 12 full graham crackers)

2 tablespoons granulated sugar

6 tablespoons salted butter, melted

For the Filling:

16oz cream cheese, softened 34 cup powdered sugar, sifted 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 cup cold heavy cream

For the Red Swirl:

- 1 cup fresh strawberries (hulled and chopped) or raspberries
- 1-2 tablespoons granulated sugar

For the Blue Swirl:

1 cup fresh blueberries 1-2 tablespoons granulated sugar


EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake







IN AN EMERGENCY




