



WATER QUALITY REPORT: LAKER OR TRUNK SLAMMER?

Those of us who have spent years on Birch Lake take pride in our water quality – we are "Lakers!" It means you will hear children and grandchildren giggle as they play in the water. They dig in the sand and later it turns into a muck fight. They practice their swim strokes, jump off the pier into your arms, then they do it by themselves to howls and clapping. They learn to ski, then graduate to slalom, then maybe wake board or surf (with proper wake usage, of course).



It's also tube rides with brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, moms, dads and friends while continuing to laugh and scream. Kids learn to fish, catch minnows and turtles, and kayak around the lake. And they get paid a penny a piece for every Zebra Mussel they remove from the pier! They learn to sail a Sunfish and then an MC and maybe enter a regatta. Birch Lake provides a place for kids and grandkids to enjoy a couple weeks at Camp Tannadoonah. They enjoy the magic of sparklers, the sweet taste of S'mores, and then the fireworks on the 4th of July, after which the following morning the whole family heads to the camp for a breakfast of pancakes and sausage!

Lake kids suffer through grown up boat rides and fall asleep in grandma's arms. Or they practice "driving" the boat with grandpa. They enjoy childhood memories that shaped generations to respect and cherish the lake we share. It needs to become a part of who they are and the kinds of adults they will be. They will be kind, considerate of neighbors, and environmentally responsible. They will be a part of a community that will always support and care for them. Just ask a young adult lake kid about the support of the lake community.

We need to protect this lake so all our families can enjoy these memories. We all are a part of the future of our beloved lake. We hope we can entrust the care of Birch Lake to the next generation. We should all know the rules that will help our lake continue to be a place to treasure. If we get lazy and blow grass clippings and leaves into our lake, use our wake boats irresponsibly, use fertilizer with phosphorus on our lawns, forget to keep our shorelines "turtle" friendly, and are not careful with runoff into the lake from our yards and the road – we will suffer the consequences, long and short term, along with our future Birch Lakers.

Growing up, I was taught there were "Lakers" and there were "Trunk

Slammers." We were honored to be called "Lakers." We had





BIRCH LAKE HISTORY: THE "LOVE SHACK"

Tur time at The Love Shack began in June of 2010, although that wasn't when my Birch Lake days began. Let me first digress a little.

My family started out at Birch Lake by driving around the lakes area on a fall color tour and discovered an old farmhouse for sale on the East Side. They purchased the house, barn and property from the Anderson's in 1970 (ish).

My brother Steve and I were summer kids for a couple of years, enjoying all the lake had to offer. Once the house was remodeled in 1973-74, we moved to the lake full-time, one of only a dozen or so families that lived on the lake year round at that time.

We utilized the barn for more than the parties that had previously been thrown (judging by all the old streamer bits stapled to the big beams), housing three horses, some chickens and a lamb that was abandoned by her mama when she was born. Dad and Linda were married in 1977 and my siblings Tina and Matt Strukel moved in and joined in on all of the lake fun.

The "Curtis Compound" grew when my grandparents built a house on property to the north (now Gaik's), and in 1993 my dad and Linda built a house on the hill by the barn (recently purchased by the Mosiers). The original house stayed in the family when Steve bought it, and he still resides there with his wife Deborah. While I didn't have my own place on the lake, I was lucky enough to have two houses at Birch Lake to visit during the summers until Eric and I bought the cottage from the Dennert's in 2010, which we gave the name of The Love Shack.

The cottage was built sometime in the early 1900's in the slight inlet area that was called Willow Beach. In the 1860 plat map of Cass County, the land that would

later be platted as Willow Beach was owned by M. Rawson, and in 1872 it was owned by J. Treego. By 1897, the land was owned by Clifford A. Lyon, who had it platted as Willow Beach sometime before 1914. In 1934, Lester Myers purchased the lot where the cottage is located and then sold it to William Wagner in 1944

In 1946, Laurence and Verna Dennert bought the cottage from the Wagners, for \$500 and four generations of the family enjoyed their time spent at the lake. The Dennerts had two sons, Larry, Jr. and Paul, who were 6 and 1 at the time they aquired the cottage.

As a high schooler at South Bend Central their son, Paul, was an original member of a local band called The Rivieras. formed in 1961. The band was named for a then-popular Buick sedan. In 1963, The Rivieras recorded "California Sun", which climbed the Rock Charts, topping out at #2 behind The Beatles' "I Want to Hold Your Hand"! Birch Lakers from the 1960s and 70s fondly recall jamming at the lake with Paul, who was the drummer.

Today the cottage still retains the old knotty pine walls and funky tile floors, which I love! It's small (which is where "Shack" comes in) but is perfect for what we wanted, since we weren't planning on being full-time lakers.

Thankfully my love for all the charm and whimsy, and my intent on keeping

c. 2007 when the sewers were put in it a cottage hit a soft spot with Larry and Kay Dennert, and they sold the cottage to us since they knew we were not going to tear it down and rebuild. We did some remodeling, most notably the glass sliders on the front and adding the deck, and I'm forever grateful that Larry was able to visit a couple of times before he passed to see the progress - he was so delighted with the improvements.


He said how much he knew Kay was kicking him in the behind for not doing the same thing while they had it (unfortunately Kay passed the winter before we bought the cottage). In good ol' Birch Lake community / family fashion, Mike Dennert (Larry and Kay's son) stopped by the cottage a few years after we bought it. While I'm sure it was bittersweet, he too was happy with the changes we had made and appreciative that we kept it as a cottage. There have been some summer days that we were not going to be staying at the cottage and offered Mike the chance to stay and enjoy the cottage once again. Once a Birch Laker, always a Birch Laker!





SUMMER RECIPES: FRESH SUMMER BERRY PIE

If there's one recipe that makes me think of summer, it's a fresh strawberry pie. Fresh, cool and sweet, this strawberry pie recipe came from my mom (Sherry Holleman) on a handwritten notecard that said "Azar's Strawberry Pie." Azar's (Big Boy) is a regional restaurant that is known for their comfort food and homemade desserst, especially this strawberry pie recipe. It's a must for those fresh summer berries!

While the original recipe only includes strawberries, I like to make it with a mix of strawberries, raspberries, and blueberries, or some combination of those three. Make it with a homemade crust, or a frozen pie crust - either way is delicious. It's a perfect dessert on a hot summer evening! Make sure to plan ahead - you will want to refrigerate at least 4 hours or overnight before serving.

Ingredients:

- 1 9-inch pie shell, baked until golden brown
- 4 cups of strawberries, sliced (alternatively, try it with a mix of strawberries, blueberries, and red raspberries)
- 1 cup cold water
- 34 cup of granulated sugar (adjust to taste I usually use less)
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 3 ounces strawberry or red raspberry gelatin

Instructions:

- 1. Bake pie shell as directed. Cool completely.
- 2. Clean and slice berries, and place in shell.
- 3. In small saucepan, mix cold water, sugar, and cornstarch. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Boil until the mixture is clear and thick.
- 4. Remove the saucepan from heat and add the strawberry gelatin, stirring until dissolved. Let cool to room temperature (this is important!).
- 5. Pour sauce over the strawberries in the pie shell. Refrigerate at least 4 hours or overnight.
- 6. Serve chilled with whipped cream.


EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

There are six (6) automated external defribrillator units (AEDs) on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations:

- **1. West Shore:** Sheffieck Home 62875 Birch Lakeview Drive
- **2. North Shore:** Smitley Home 14859 Birch Northshore Drive
- **3. East Shore:** Vitale Home 63174 Birch Road
- **4. Southeast Shore:** Troeger Home 63696 Birch Road
- **5. South Shore:** Crawford Home 15046 Birch Lakeshore Drive
- **6. Southwest Shore:** De Young Home 63255 Storey Hill Street

All units are on the **ROAD SIDE** of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.






IN AN EMERGENCY

- CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, take it to the patient, and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow directions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions, and stay with the patient until emergency personnel arrive.






Star Battle Puzzle




Arithmagons


