In 2003, my wife Sharon and I, along with my brothers







#### WATER QUALITY REPORT: A SAD DAY

hat happens if "we," the Birch Lake residents, can't take care of our lake? What if an invasive species takes over, chokes the waterway and "we" don't have enough money to combat it? Think I'm crazy? Try kayaking down the St. Joseph River, like we did last week, where most of it was weed choked with Eurasian Milfoil, leaving only thin swaths of current to navigate downstream.



What would "we" do?

The option most used is to create a Special Assessment District, or the appropriately named SAD. It's a time-consuming and expensive endeavor whereby the state of Michigan manages the water quality of the lake. In essence, you give them the keys, they bill you for their services, and they drive the boat.

Here's how it works: most inland lakes in Michigan are located within townships, like Birch Lake, and the Township Public Improvement Act of 1954 (often called "Public Act 188 of 1954) is the mechanism to finance certain types of lake improvement projects, including aquatic plant control. The costs for SAD are funded through assessments of the property owners within the district (in our case, the Birch Lake homeowners), in addition to the legal expense of setting one up, and the extended period involving petitions, public hearings and township votes to get it on the property tax rolls. Meanwhile, your lake continues to deteriorate.

When establishing a SAD, there is always a valid concern that the lake residents will lose control. Therefore, it's considered a last resort. In some cases, it's the only option to garner sufficient funds to save the lake. In all cases, it allows residents to collectively pool their resources to achieve clearly defined objectives – which is a polite way of saying "We'll tell you what needs to be done and how much it will cost."


At this point, you might be saying, "Sounds good to me. At least I won't be hounded by the Water Quality Committee to donate money." But before acquiescing, consider this: according to the Michigan Lakes and Streams Association, it costs about \$2,000 to treat one acre of invasive weeds on a lake. Birch Lake is 295 acres. If only a third of the lake needs treatment (say, for instance, the shallow shoreline) that's \$196,000 of treatment per year. Spread over the 225 residences that would be forced to pay, that's almost \$900 per home EVERY YEAR. Suck on that next time you balk at donating \$100. Not to mention that they'd probably have to close the lake for treatment for most of the summer. Explain that to your grandkids, "Well, honey, you see, not enough people on the lake donated to the Water Quality fund, so now you have to pay the price..." You get the picture.

Think I'm overreacting? Think again. Of the 11,000 inland lakes in MI, over 30% are managed under a SAD. Over 30% are assessed annually on their property taxes, like it or not, and many do not. Research indicates there are numerous lawsuits that are trying to get a SAD overturned, that is, giving jurisdiction back to the homeowners, with little success. Once it's gone, it's gone.

One might say, "If we have a situation that dire, the residents will step up, like they always have." Maybe yes, maybe no. I'd hate to find out. Rather, the intent of the Water Quality Committee is to be a trusted steward of the lake, soliciting enough money to ward off any intrusion Mother Nature can throw our way, including the need for a SAD. We don't need or want outside political influences controlling our beautiful lake.

The solution: donate to the Birch Lake Water Quality Fund. We need everyone's help. Our goal, modest at best, is a 75% participation rate to the fund from the lake community. We're far from it, yet it's arguably the most important asset in our community. It is perplexing, to say the least, especially if everyone's support is critical to the well-being of our lake.

The alternative, you guessed it, might be a SAD day.





ur white-sided, two-story home has a red brick front and is located on the northeast side of Birch Lake. It's been part of Lazy Lodge or the Lazy Lodge Resort since the early 1900s when it was a one-room white cottage with an outhouse. It was one of six cottages rented and managed by the owners of the main house or lodge located across the road where the Wozniaks live. Today we share a 60-foot deep and 100-foot wide lakefront with five other families. This is my family's story.

Mrs. Cassius King has been in several times getting "Lazy Lodge" into shape for occupancy. She has autoed in from Michigan City as the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Cole, who spend many days at various times through the season at the lake.

The Resort was known as "Lazy Lodge" as far back as 1912. Cassopolis Vigilant, June 27, 1912, p. 4

My parents are Ray and Sonia Sanders. The family connections began when Peter J. and Wanda Winiarski bought the Lazy Lodge Resort from Oren and Mable Fulkerson in 1942. My mom is Sonia Korzin Sanders. Her sister Marie married Peter's brother Bruno "Barney" in 1946.

Peter's physician in Chicago advised him to move out of the city to the clean air of the "country." As kids we would refer to Birch Lake as going to "the country." Pete and Wanda Winiarski took this advice seriously, and in 1942 - after discovering an ad in the Chicago Tribune - purchased the Birch Lake property and Lazy Lodge home with six cottages and began their adventure on Birch Lake. Because of WWII, they did not move in until 1947.

The original home | was closer to the shoreline. They rebuilt it in the early 1950s and is the current brick ranch and foundation for the Wozniak's beautiful garden-filled property. The Winiarskis sold hamburgers, hotdogs, milkshakes, banana splits, and ice cream cones from their new lodge to the renters and anyone on the lake and the take away window is still in place.

They did not rent rooms from their home. They rented the six cottages and six metal rowboats. The lakefront had a beautiful wide open sandy shoreline.

In 1961 the Winiarskis decided to sell their cottages. The current renters were offered first purchase. Bruno "Barney"

and Marie Winiarski were renting cottage #1 so they bought it and named it Bee-Jay after Barney's initials, BI for Bruno Joseph. My parents rented this cottage from them the same two weeks each July. Families rented the other cottages every summer the same weeks we did. There would be two dozen people staying in these cottages so it was a busy place. The

renter's pier was filled with people all day long. The Winiarskis had their own private pier.

The other cottages were sold to people you may remember. Joe and Helen Harris bought cottages #2 and #3. They rebuilt the current modern style home Margie Trybus owns. Jim and Eunice Kelly bought cottages #4 and #5 and rebuilt the current yellow shingled home Jackie and Steve Frew own.

Cottage #6 was purchased by LaVern "Mort" and Jean Hunt who sold it around 1970 to Jack and Marianne Hornbeck. Their daughter Carol and her husband Kerry McCoy rebuilt their two-story blue house in 2015. Jackie Frew and Carol McCoy are sisters. Wanda Winiarski and Jean Hunt are sisters.

An additional property in the back of our shared parking area was sold to Wanda's brother Mathew "Mac" Klimek. It did not include a cottage. He added a mobile home. When he passed away the Wozniaks purchased the property. These five properties shared the 100-foot lakefront and parking area.

Peter J. Winiarski died unexpectedly in September of 1962, one year after they

sold the cottages. His wife Wanda continued to live on the lake with their son Peter and her father Dzai Dzai. Four years later, in 1966, Marie Winiarski died from lung cancer. Within seven weeks Barney Winiarski died. Aunt Marie and Uncle Barney had no children but many brothers and sisters. Many Lazy Lodge Fishing Report, rented cottage #1 over the years. My mom's parents, Donna and Michael Korzin purchased the cottage

> from the estate and then my parents, Ray and Sonia Sanders purchased it from my grandparents in 1969.

> Around 1970, Wanda Winiarski sold a piece of her property up the hill on Birch Road to her sister Jean and her husband LaVern "Mort" Hunt where they built a

home. This home is now owned by Jean's daughter, Pat, and her husband Terry Keirn. They also share our lake frontage. Also of note, Tim Burchell - who has a place on the south side and Pat Keirn are brother and sister.

My parents rebuilt the cottage when they retired in 1982. After a huge storm knocked two trees onto the house in 1997, they added

a second story. Dave and I bought my sister's half of the property in 2019 when my mom passed away at 100 years old!

Each of the Lazy Lodge families have their own memories. My sister, Lisa Lyle's and my favorite childhood memories from the 60s and 70s are walking to Breece's store in Williamsville for candy and junk jewelry, chasing swarms of fireflies, walks with my Dad while singing songs, catching toads, gathering with all the kids to eat popcorn on rainy days, feeding the fish pieces of bread at the end of the pier, lying prone on the pier and dipping our fingers in the lake for the fish to nibble on, learning to water ski and pushing myself to try to keep up with my sister Lisa, who skied as well as most boys on the lake, jump-starting on one ski from our beautiful wide and open sandy shoreline, watching a group of about 12 older boys jump-starting to ski together behind one boat from our shoreline, sailing our Snipe, swimming back and forth along the shoreline, swimming to the raft and playing under it, star gazing from the end of the pier, night swimming, running and walking around the lake, watching the dozens of piglets kept in the little culvert just up a ½ block from the lake on Sears St., and rides around the horse corral on the Sears / Larson / Witchie family horses.

Our three daughters and two sonin-laws all chose to settle down within two hours of Birch Lake. Emily and her husband Joe Wodark bought a cottage on the south side up on the hill three years ago. Our five grandchildren are the 5th generation to enjoy this treasure!

#### SUMMER RECIPES: SHRIMP & ZUCCHINI SCAMPI

id you know? National *Sneak Some Zucchini Onto Your Neighbor's Porch Day* is celebrated on August 8<sup>th</sup>. This humorous holiday encourages people to share their excess zucchini harvest with neighbors, often in a playful, surreptitious manner. The "holiday" was created by a radio personality in Pennsylvania, Thomas Roy, as a way to deal with the overabundance of zucchini produced during peak season. The day is meant to be a fun way to deal with the abundance of zucchini that many gardeners experience. If anyone wants to sneak some zucchini onto our porch, my kids would be thrilled! (Really - they love it!)

This quick and easy dinner can be served over noodles, or on its own for a healthier, low-carb option. Add some fresh cherry tomatoes for extra summery flavor. This shrimp scampi with zucchini comes together quickly, so make sure you've got all your ingredients prepped and ready to go before you start cooking!

#### Ingredients

2 cups zucchini, sliced into thin rounds

- 1 lb shrimp, raw
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/3 cup chicken broth or dry white wine
- ¼ cup fresh parsley
- 1 lemon, sliced into wedges
- 1 lb of pasta (optional) linguine is a good choice

#### Instructions:

- 1. Season the raw shrimp with salt and pepper to taste.
- 2. If you are serving over pasta, bring your water to a boil and start the pasta. Follow directions to cook to al dente.
- 3. In a large skillet with 1 tablespoon of olive oil, sauté the zucchini on medium-high heat until lightly browned. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Set the zucchini aside.

- 4. Lower the heat to medium. Melt the butter with the other tablespoon of olive oil and then add the garlic. Sauté for about 1 minute, stirring frequently until the garlic is tender and fragrant.
- 5. Add the broth or dry white wine to the pan. Bring the heat up to medium-high and simmer to let the sauce reduce for another minute or two. Stir frequently.
- 6. Add the shrimp to the pan. Cook about 2-3 minutes on each side. Cook until pink on both sides. Be careful not to overcook the shrimp!
- 7. When the shrimp are just cooked, toss the zucchini back into the pan with the fresh parsley.
- 8. Finish with a squeeze of fresh lemon juice and garnish with the lemon slices.
- 9. Serve on its own or over noodles of your choice.






## EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

All units are on the **ROAD SIDE** of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.







#### IN AN EMERGENCY


