BIRCH LAKE HISTORY: THE CRANMER FAMILY

ortha Wagner was born on a farm in rural Cass County in 1904. Her grandparents, Egbert and Clara Wagner immigrated here from Germany and settled in Porter Township in the 1850s. Their farm was near Carter Lake. Dortha's parents, Albert and Edith Wagner, also had a farm on the southern edge of Porter Township, near Indian and Baldwin Lakes.

Dortha met Joseph Cranmer, who lived in Elkhart, and while they were dating in the 1920s they camped and fished with friends at Doane's Cove on Birch Lake. Joe bought lots #311 and #312 on the west side sometime around 1930. They were married in 1931 and began living together at Birch Lake in a cottage that Joe built on #312 (where the Remington's live now). They also had a small cottage on #311 but it was not winterized.

Joe worked in Elkhart at the Conn Instrument factory, where they made and repaired musical instruments. The family still has his company-issued Craftsman wooden toolbox, with its tiny files and picks for instrument repairs. At the lake, he also rented out boats to visitors and fishermen. Dortha served as the Controller for the City of Elkhart.

Joe and Dortha's only child, Harold, was born in 1936. As a Birch Lake resident

since his birth in 1936, Harold is likely the longest-tenured living lake resident in 2025. The Cranmers continued living at the lake full time until approximately 1942 was when Harold about 6 years old, at which time they moved to Elkhart for him to attend school.

Harold described the west side shoreline as so dense with oldgrowth trees that you could see little of the lake from the road. He also recalls his

mother giving him an empty cloth sack and sending him to walk to Williamsville to have it filled with freshly-milled flour.

In 1944, the Cranmers sold #312 (now owned by the Remingtons) to Dr. Howard Lahr, who also owned #313 (now owned by Karen Brovold). The Cranmers continued to live in the cottage at #311 until they tore it down sometime in the late 50s and built the current house. When Joe retired from Conn in 1965, they moved back to the lake full time.

Harold married Donna Longenecker in 1955. Their three children, Bob, Julie, and Steve, loved visiting Birch Lake over the years. Donna was active in the Birch Lake Yacht Club, and Harold and Bob were avid sailors. For many years, Harold helped set the buoys for the races.

After Joe's death in 1977, Dortha continued to live at the lake, with her grandson Bob often staying with her at the cottage. When Dortha passed away in 1986, her grandson Steve moved to the lake house full time. Steve was an active member of the BLYC, serving as a board member for many years. He participated in the annual BLYC triathlons and also

chaired the kids' triathlon for several years.

Today the house is shared by Harold, his son-in-law Steve Plaia, and grandsons Chad and Jared Plaia. Chad and Jared are the 4th generation of Cranmers to enjoy the beauty of Birch Lake.

SUMMER RECIPES: CRISPY COCONUT SHRIMP

olden, sweet, and crisp, coconut shrimp is a crowd-favorite finger food and it always flies off the serving platter especially if you serve it with spicy sweet dipping sauce. This shrimp recipe makes the perfect midweek meal or quick appetizer because the ingredients are simple and there's minimal cook time.

Make sure you purchase large, raw, peeled shrimp with tails attached for this recipe. I recommend tails attached because the coconut shrimp are easy to prep, coat, and handle as an appetizer that way. Feel free to remove the tails before starting, if desired.

Panko is better in this recipe than regular breadcrumbs because it ensures a crunchy texture. Panko breadcrumbs stay crispier than regular breadcrumbs because they do not absorb as much grease and liquid during the frying process.

I also recommend you use sweetened shredded coconut. The sugar on the coconut shreds melts and the coating becomes crisp and slightly caramelized.

Ingredients

1/3 cup all-purpose flour1/2 teaspoon salt1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

2 large eggs, beaten
¾ cup Panko bread crumbs

1 cup sweetened shredded coconut

1 pound large raw shrimp, peeled and deveined with tails attached

3-4 tablespoons vegetable oil or coconut oil Thai Chili sauce for dipping (optional) Orange, peach, or apricot jam for dipping (optional) Cilantro for garnish (optional)

Instructions:

1. Start with three medium bowls. Combine flour, salt, and pepper in one. Beat the eggs in the second bowl. Combine Panko and coconut in the third bowl.

- 2. Dip the shrimp into the flour, then the eggs, and then dredge the shrimp into the coconut mixture, pressing gently to adhere. You want a lot of coconut on each shrimp. Set the coated shrimp aside on a plate as you coat the remaining shrimp.
- 3. Add enough oil to cover the bottom of a large skillet over medium heat. Fry the coconut shrimp in batches maybe 7 8 shrimp at a time—do not crowd them in the pan. Flip after 2 minutes and fry the other side for 2 minutes or until golden brown. We prefer ours a little darker, so I fry each side for about 2½ to 3 minutes.
- 4. Place the finished coconut shrimp on a plate lined with a paper towel as you fry the rest. Sprinkle with finely chopped cilantro. Mix dipping sauce ingredients together and serve with shrimp.
- 5. Cover and store leftover shrimp in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.






EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

All units are on the **ROAD SIDE** of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.







IN AN EMERGENCY




