





WATER QUALITY REPORT

HYDRODYNAMICS AND THEIR IMPACTS

field study of recreational powerboat hydrodynamics and their impacts on the water column and lakebed has just been released from the University of Minnesota, St. Anthony Falls Laboratory.

The report, long-anticipated and as a follow-up to our early-season recommendations on wake and ski boat operation, gives us answers about what is happening below the surface in our lake during boat activity. This isn't MI law (yet). But in the interest of her majesty, the lake, we appreciate your indulgence.

Spoiler alert: it's recommended that wake boats operate in 20ft of water or greater when in surfing mode to minimize impacts on the lake bottom. Also, "dock starts" are detrimental to the lake bottom in water 10ft or less.

The field-based study was motivated by a need to better understand the environmental impacts within the water column and the lakebed of different types of powerboats. The objectives:

- 1. Clarify the hydrodynamic phenomena created by a powerboat in motion in different water depths
- 2. Investigate the depth of penetration and duration of emission gases (engine exhaust bubbles)
- 3. Investigate the water column velocities and depth of penetration of the bow, stern and the transverse waves and their potential to resuspend lakebed sediment
- 4. Investigate the prop wash velocity
- 5. Investigate the effects of repeated boat passage in the water column
- 6. Capture underwater and video of the hydrodynamic phenomena and any subsequent impacts

Here's are the Cliff's Notes of the findings:

The boats were tested under two operational conditions, representative of their typical usage. For the deck and bowrider styles, this was in the displacement mode (leisure) and planing mode (cruising); for the wake boats this was semi-displacement mode (surfing) and planing mode (cruising).

The report identified three distinct hydrodynamic phenomena produced by common recreational powerboats that have the potential to impact the water



column and lakebed (pontoons were not included in the report):

- 1. Bow and Stern Pressure Waves (deck boats, and runabouts): When running with no or little wake in shallow water (10 ft or less), the bow and stern waves were found to be the primary hydrodynamic phenomena that initiates the movement of lakebed sediments but were not sufficient to cause sustained sediment resuspension. If creating a wake, sustained sediment suspension takes place in shallow waters. Take Away: Avoid areas that are 10ft or shallower when creating a wake.
- 2. Transverse Gravity Waves (wake boats): These are boats that make V-shaped waves behind the boat: These waves have crests that are perpendicular to the travel of direction of the boat and move at approximately the same speed as the boat, so they appear, from a passenger's perspective, to be a stationary feature of the wake. Transverse waves penetrate deep into the water column, persist for several minutes and generate velocities large enough to resuspend sediment. Take Away: When in surf mode, operate in 20ft depth or greater (which is about 500 ft from each shore).
- 3. Propeller Wash (Prop Wash): Shown to impact the water column for several minutes after the boat passes and, under certain modes of operation, contributed to the resuspension of sediment. It was further noted that prop wash can directly cause shearing and complete uprooting of submerged aquatic vegetation. Take away: No dock starts and no power loading at the boat launch.

Summary:

If you're on your evening (or afternoon!) cocktail cruise, operate in 10ft

of water or deeper. And remember, turn left.

Skiers and tubers: start in 10-15ft water depth and please don't venture inland. Also, no dock starts (fewer splinters that way, too. You're welcome.)

Wake boats: Operate in 20ft of water or deeper (500ft from shore) when in surf mode to minimize impacts to the lake bottom. Dude, that's, like, so gnarly.



- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues.

DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season


DNF (Did Not Finish) or DSQ (Disqualified) scores as last place (if 5 boats started the race, you will be scored as 5th place).

DNF, DSQ are not counted toward minimum number of races needed

CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total.

Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted

CAMP T CORNER

amp 2025 has come to a close, and now we turn our attention to the fall season and our school year programs. We have a busy fall ahead!

This week we have had a rental group at camp all week. This is the 8th year that we have hosted the *Village Up North* camp. They are a group from the Basilica of Saint Mary in Livonia, Michigan. Each year they rent Camp for a week to run their own program. This year they brought their largest group yet - 100 campers!

For the most part, this group provides all of their own staff and programming. This year, our kitchen manager, Mr. Conway, is running their food service, and we are providing lifeguards for the waterfront, and archery instruction. You'll likely see their canoers and kayakers out on the water in the afternoons, and their pontoon pulling tubers.

Next week we have three different rentals at camp during the week. On Tuesday night and Wednesday during the day, Corewell Health (Niles) is hosting a Wilderness Medicine training for their residents. They plan to camp out at camp (mostly in tents!) on Tuesday night, and then have a training most of the day on Wednesday. I don't know what this year's training theme is, but in the past they have done search and rescue trainings and one year they did a missing boater training in the lake. They wrap up with a late lunch on Wednesday.

Wednesday afternoon, we welcome a cross county team from *Embrace Sportz*, a non profit organization focused on encouraging sports participation in underprivileged communities. I met the founders of the program at a workshop last winter, and we talked at lunch about hosting them for a week at camp. We were excited to be able to coordinate with them to come here from Wednesday to Sunday next week! We will provide meals and some programming (lifeguards, archery, teambuilding activities), and they will also run on our property, around the lake, and at Dr. Lawless Park.

And then Thursday the Junior High students and teachers from Good Shepherd Montessori School arrive at camp for a one-night retreat. We are very familiar with the Good Shepherd students as we run their after school programs during the school year, and we're thrilled to be able to have them come to camp to open the school year with a fun bonding experience.

After next week, most of our groups and rentals at camp are on the weekends only. This fall we have a family gathering on the weekend of Labor Day, a reunion event in early September, our own Grown Up Camp event in late September, and a wedding in early October.

We're also gearing up for our before and after school programs. We currently have three sites for before and after school: Good Shepherd Montessori School, Sam



Adams Elementary in Cassopolis, and Edwardsburg Intermediate School in Edwardsburg. The starts of their school years are all different, which makes it nice for our staff. Good Shepherd starts on Monday, August 18, Sam Adams starts on Monday, August 25, and Edwardsburg starts on Tuesday, September 2. With the staggered starts, we're able to get one school up and running and figure out routines, and then move to the next school to get them off and running.

And once the school year programs get going, we start planning for next camp season all over again!

The Ball family's love affair with Birch Lake began in 1948 when Vernon and Genevieve Ball discovered this piece of heaven. Living close by were their two children who spent weekends here with their children. Vern even got his brothers interested in renting at Birch Lake. Today, there are two families of Vern and Genevieve's descendents, with five generations enjoying this wonderful place.

When Vern passed in 1962, his son John and wife Marty purchased the cottage, and his wife and four children spent their summers here. John commuted daily to work in Elkhart.

The family enjoyed boating, yacht club activities, skiing, sailing, and entertaining friends. There were walks around the lake and trips to Lanky's. The older siblings, Cindy and John Jr., had a large group of friends who were Junior Yacht Club members. Dances and hayrides and other Junior Yacht Club activities were held with an adult chaperone to supervise. Walks around the lake as a group was often the norm.

Julie was the third of the four siblings, and remembers the juke box at the yacht club had current music playing every time there was a gathering of kids there. She remembers a few boys gar fishing at night with a large flashlight and spears. Some friends built a boat called the

"*American Woman*" (for the popular song released in 1970 by The Guess Who).

Julie says her group of lake friends was a bit smaller than the older kids' group, which included Pete Winiarski, Tim Burchell, Steve King, Jill Tunnicliffe (Scholes), and Sue Davis (among many others!). Julie's group enjoyed going out on their own motorized fishing boats making waves and bouncing over them. They went to a lot of the Junior Yacht Club activities, too, and she did a lot of ski watching!

The youngest Ball brother, Steve, didn't have a group to hang out with, besides a couple good buddies. They all learned to slalom ski and how to sail a Sunfish. John Sr. and Marty loved to sail and even fit their best friends on the sailboat with them - four adults on a Sunfish! A few cocktails were enjoyed beforehand.

As the siblings married and grandchildren came along, the family grew to 15, and a deckboat was their next boat in the early 80s. They decorated it for many boat parades over the years. The family enjoyed celebrating birthdays and playing cards together on the weekends. Extended family would visit each summer. John Sr.'s favorite place was on a lounge chair on the end of the pier with his pipe and a martini.

SUMMER RECIPES: TENNESSEE ONIONS

nions don't get the credit they deserve. They're the backbone of soups, casseroles, and pasta dishes. They're also wonderful chopped or sliced and served raw on salads, sandwiches, even burgers.

But even the most ardent onion fan has probably never heard of Tennessee Onions. This creamy, cheese casserole is so much more than the sum of its parts. Try it once, and we know you'll agree.

Learn how to make Tennessee Onions, and keep the recipe for this onion casserole handy. You'll be asked to bring it to every family gathering from now on. We aren't sure whether to call these onions a side dish or a condiment. So really, we'll treat them as both.

A scoop of these at a potluck or barbecue will be welcomed by all, but we also want to eat them on burgers, atop grilled chicken or steak, or even in between slices of bread for an onionrich grilled cheese.

Ingredients

- 2½ pounds sweet onions (about 3 large onions), sliced crosswise into ¼ inch slices and separated into rings. We strongly recommend Vidalia Onions.
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley flakes
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- ½ teaspoon dried oregano
- ½ teaspoon dry mustard
- ¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
- ¼ cup salted butter, cut into ¼ inch thick pieces
- 4 ounces mild Cheddar cheese, shredded. About 1 cup.
- 4 ounces smoked Gouda cheese, shredded. About 1 cup. Cooking spray

Instructions:


- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 2. Coat a 9- x 13-inch baking dish with cooking spray.
- 3. Place the onions in a large bowl. Sprinkle with thyme, parsley, garlic salt, oregano, dry mustard, and cayenne pepper. Toss gently to coat.
- 4. Arrange onions evenly in the baking dish.
- 5. Dot butter evenly over the onions, and sprinkle with the Cheddar and Gouda cheeses.
- 6. Cover with aluminum foil and bake in the preheated oven until onions are soft and the sides are bubbly, approximately 40 minutes
- 7. Remove the foil, and continue baking at 350°F until the top is golden brown, about 30 more minutes.
- 8. Serve as a side dish, or to top a hamburger, grilled chicken or steak, barbecued pork, or with toasted bread for a decadent grilled cheese.




EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

All units are on the **ROAD SIDE** of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.







IN AN EMERGENCY


