Fireworks	\$741	(\$1,371)	(\$630)	Growing issue . Donations for 2025's Show were \$800 less than it cost us. Between tariffs, reduced availability from China and our trend of lower donations, it is likely the 2026 Show will be smaller.
General	\$3,268	\$25,940	\$29,208	Several actions contributed to our higher balance: 1) We received \$14,000 in insurance proceeds for the roof damage (the insurance premiums over the years were paid from the General Fund); 2) "Angel Donors" contributed \$5,300 to fill the projected budget deficit; 3) The Barker's revenues were \$4,900 higher due to new advertisers, a generous sponsor and higher ad rates; and 4) Higher Dues contributed an additional \$2,400.

4th OF JULY FIREWORKS DILEMMA

This note goes out to all Birch Lakers.

We are closing out another wonderful summer here at Birch Lake. The weather has been perfect for enjoying the lake, but I am looking forward to Labor Day and a return to cooler weather, maybe a drop in temperature into the mid-70s til Halloween would be nice.

Unfortunately, we are looking at something a little spookier than the Ghosts and Goblins that knock on your door come Halloween evening. Because of the uncertainties that have been unfolding in the worldwide economies, we have been warned that the wholesale pricing of fireworks will potentially *double* between our recent 2025 4th of July Fireworks Display and next year's Fireworks Extravaganza. We are already working with our fireworks provider to mitigate the increases for 2026, but we know the cost for next year's display is going up.

To add insult to this pending issue that may put a damper on our 4th of July Celebration for next year, we are faced with an issue that has not happened in many years: we have not



collected enough in donations to cover the cost of this year's display. While our latest fireworks display was wonderful as usual, and Birch Lake was full of crowded boats viewing from the water, and those watching from on shore enjoyed the capstone of our annual 4th of July Celebration, we came away with a shortfall in donations. This situation has led us to our dilemma.

If we are not able to cover the cost of our 4th fireworks when our current cost was lower than the prior year, how can we move forward with scheduling the Birch Lake 4th of July Fireworks display for

WATER QUALITY REPORT: UPDATE ON ACTIVITIES

Summer's in the home stretch and you've got better stuff to do then read articles on water quality (like burn sweet corn on the grill and wonder which QB will start for the Irish), so here's a brief update on your Water Quality Committee's activities the last month:

- 1. In late July, we re-treated the Eurasian Milfoil on the east side of the lake. The first treatment wasn't as effective as expected so we requested and received another. There was no charge for the second treatment.
- 2. We have applied for a permit to treat the small area (Milfoil) on the north side of the lake. The permitting process takes a while due to local and state signoffs. However, we should have it within the next few months and anticipate treating that area in the spring.
- 3. Also in July, our Purple Loosestrife crew, Cindy Bernaciak and Tom Kuhn, (deemed the "Terminators") cruised the shoreline looking for the invasive plant. As in past years, there were two spots: one on the south side and one on the north. Plants were found and carefully removed, and the locations were documented. The good news is that no new locations were found. Despite that, another trip is planned as a follow-up, on August 21st.
- 4. In early September, our sampling crew headed by Jennifer and John Ball will be testing for summer phosphorus



levels, dissolved oxygen and temperature readings, and chlorophyll levels. Samples will be delivered to the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program (CLMP) for testing, analysis, and comparison to past Birch Lake samplings and surrounding lakes in Southwest Michigan. Any changes from previous late-summer readings will be discussed and analyzed. We'll publish the report in the spring.

Fundraising continues to be a head scratcher. Although total donations have been slightly higher than the last few years, participation levels are still only hovering around 50% of the lake residents. For those that have given, thank you! Those who have not, it's not too late! It's odd how virtually 100% of the lake residents use the lake but only 56% invest in its future. Please consider giving today.


THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

AN ODD DAY OF SAILING

his past weekend, the MCs completed their 18th to 20th races for the season, with the Sunfish logging races 15 to 17. Not too shabby for how the year started. The forecasted wind looked borderline sailable. Sunday morning rolled around, and it turned out to be a cloudy day with decent wind, so I decided to give sailing a go. The boats got out to the start line, and the clouds parted, then the sun came out. Unfortunately for us sailors, this also meant the wind died down to practically zero mph with a few lucky gusts here and there. Luckily, this lasted only for several minutes.

Right before it was time to start the races, the clouds came back, and so did the wind. I guess the sailing/wind gods were toying with us. All joking aside, the course still turned out to be quite challenging. The wind was very fickle, with plenty of wind shifts, gusts, and holes. As a sailor, there isn't much worse than getting caught in what we begrudgingly call a hole. DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season


DNF (Did Not Finish) or DSQ (Disqualified) scores as last place (if 5 boats started the race, you will be scored as 5th place).

DNF, DSQ are not counted toward minimum number of races needed

CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total.

Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted

BIRCH LAKE HISTORY: THE KRAU / TUNNICLIFFE / SCHOLES FAMILY

Editor's Note: This season in the Barker, we plan to feature different properties on the lake each week, with historical information about the families who have lived there, photos, and stories. 'n 1930, William Krau purchased a piece of land in Willow Beach on the east side of the lake from Clifford A. Lyon. His property was located where the Klappauf's home is today (E197). Mr. Krau was the Mayor of Elkhart at the time, having been elected to that office in November of 1929, and had previously served as an Indiana State Senator, and also as the city treasurer of the City of Elkhart.

In the late 30s, he transferred ownership of the Willow Beach property to his daughter Eva (Krau) Kimble and her husband Harry Kimble. Their daughter Joanne spent her summers at Birch Lake, often swimming and boating

with friends at Lazy Lodge, located next door to their cottage.

After Harry's passing, Eva Kimble married Fred Lunz, and they continued to spend summers at Birch Lake. Joanne married Bill Tunnicliffe, and in 1955 they purchased their own cottage at Birch Lake, also in Willow Beach. The Tunnicliffe cottage was located at E180, where the Mosier's home is today. Their children, Steve and Jill, started coming to Birch Lake when Jill was just six weeks

The family lived in Findlay, Ohio, but would come to the lake on the first day after school was out, and stay until just before school started again in the fall. Jill said that they knew they were at the lake when they saw the row of pine trees on Birch Rd., and they cried every year as they passed the pine trees leaving the lake in September.

Like many lake kids, Jill remembers walks around the lake with friends, riding Cappy - the Larson's pony, walking to "Billyville" with a quarter to buy candy at Lanky's, dance parties, playing cards on rainy days, and swimming, sailing, and skiing all summer. She also describes "horrifying" the city kids by covering themselves in mud from the lake, and jumping off the pier to rinse it off. She described going barefoot all summer, and only going inside the house for meals and sleep.

They didn't have a phone at their cottage, so their dad, Bill, would go over to Granny's place (Eva Lunz) to take business calls during the summer. The kids would go to Granny's to watch TV occasionally.

Steve, who was four years older than Jill, had a large group of friends at the lake, including Steve King, Tim Burchell,

Pete Winiarski, Steve Echols, John Ball, and Barry DeCoudres (among many others). They spent hours on the lake skiing, sailing, and riding around on the famous American Woman boat.

Jill was friends with their next door neighbor's granddaughter, Jayne Foote. One summer, she remembers that she and Jayne thought maybe they were missing out by not going to camp. They lived close to Camp Kiloqua, and decided to pretend to be campers - waking up each morning at reveille, holding their own craft classes, tennis lessons, and going to bed at taps just like the Kiloqua girls.

When Sue O'Brien and her family moved to the lake when Jill and Sue were about 12, they became fast friends (and still are!). Jill would sleep over at Sue's house when they were teens, and their neighbor Tim Burchell would come talk to them through the screen late at night. There was a climbing tree in Sue's front yard and they spent many hours in the the tree. That tree is still in Sue's (Davis) front vard at her new house today.

Jill married Ray Scholes in 1977 and their children grew up spending weekends at the lake. Ray enjoyed the lake after they met and wed, and it didn't take much convincing to get him to buy a place here! They bought We Luv It on the south side (S064) from the Eichorts in 2021. Now their grandchildren are the 6th generation to enjoy Birch Lake in the summers!



SUMMER RECIPES: BBQ CHOPPED CHICKEN SALAD

This is the best BBQ chicken chopped salad! This summer BBQ chicken chopped salad is chock-full of all the good stuff. Grilled corn, pickled onions, ripe cherry tomatoes, green onions, black beans, freshly grated cheddar and juicy grilled chicken tossed in BBQ sauce. But! The best part may be the honey mustard vinaigrette. I will never get over just how delicious it is.

Ingredients

BBQ Chicken

1 pound boneless, skinless chicken breasts Kosher salt and pepper 1 teaspoon smoked paprika 1 teaspoon garlic powder ½ teaspoon brown sugar

Salad

2 ears sweet corn
½ cup BBQ sauce
8 cups romaine lettuce, chopped
1 cup black beans, drained and rinsed, if canned
1 cup chopped cherry tomatoes
½ cup grated white cheddar cheese
½ cup pickled onions
⅓ cup sliced green onions
3 tablespoons chopped chives

Honey Mustard Vinaigrette

3 tablespoons apple cider vinegar 2 tablespoons honey 1 tablespoon dijon mustard 2 garlic cloves, finely minced or pressed ¼ teaspoon salt ¼ teaspoon pepper ½ cup extra virgin olive oil

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat your grill to high heat.
- 2. Season the chicken all over with salt and pepper. In a small bowl, stir together the paprika, garlic powder, and brown sugar. Sprinkle it all over the chicken too.
- 3. Grill the chicken for 5 to 6 minutes per side. Place the corn on the grill too, turning it every few minutes. When the chicken is close to being down, brush it with BBQ sauce. Flip it over and grill for 30 seconds, then brush again and flip. Remove the chicken from the grill and let it cool for 5 to 10 minutes. Slice the corn from the cob once cool enough.
- 4. In a bowl, whisk together the vinegar, honey, mustard, garlic, salt and pepper. Continue to whisk while streaming in the olive oil.
- 5. Place the chopped lettuce in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper and toss. Add the beans, tomatoes, cheddar, pickled onions, green onions, corn, and chives. Chop up the chicken and add it on. Drizzle with the dressing, toss it all together, and serve!






EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

All units are on the **ROAD SIDE** of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.







IN AN EMERGENCY
